- To "The Water Bailiff, Ramsbury": 1 autograph note signed: 18 Mar 1813: (MISC 4458): 1 page (double sheet): from Piccadilly: granting permission for the bearer, Mr. Johnstone, to fish at Ramsbury.
- To Thomas Holt White of Chase Lodge, Enfield: 2 letters: -- 19 Jan 1807: (S'ANA 0937a): 2 pages (double sheet): from Piccadilly: begins, "I will certainly do what you desire, but my friends are so few that I fear they will not be able greatly to promote your object . . . . " -- 1 autograph letter signed: 30 Jan 1807: (S'ANA 0937b): 1 page (double sheet): from Piccadilly: begins, "I am much obliged to you for the trouble you have taken with my Freehold . . . . ".
- · To "Gentlemen" : 1 autograph letter signed : 4 Apr 1821 : (S'ANA 0929) : on liberty and property, to be read in his absence at a meeting.
- · To "Dear Sir" : 1 autograph letter signed : 10 Oct 1811 : (MISC 4457) : 1 page (single sheet) : from Piccadilly : begins, "I understand there is a Fellowship at Sidney College Cambridge . . . . ".
- To "Hon.ble Sir" : 1 autograph note signed : 6 May 1842 : (MISC 4463) : 1 page (single sheet) : [no place] : body reads in full, "Please to Admit the Bearer to the Gallery to the House of Commons.".
