- · To James Clerk, Esq. at 222 Princes Street, Edinburgh: 2 letters: -- 1 autograph letter signed: 11 Nov 1805: (B'ANA 0525a): 4 pages (double sheet) + letter cover (single sheet): from Southwell: begins, "The death of Mr. Watson has given me much uneasiness ..."; along with a manuscript copy of Clerk's 26 Nov reply (B'ANA 0525b). -- 1 autograph letter signed: 1 Dec 1805: (B'ANA 0526): [no place]: 1 \(^1/_\) pages (double sheet): begins, "I received your letter with a bill for seventy five pound

enclosed being the interest of £3000 from Whitsuntide to Martinmas ...".

- To Mary Morrison Duff, friend of the family: 1 autograph letter signed: 15 Apr 1799: (B'ANA 0627): from Newstead Abbey: 3 ¹/_ pages (double sheet): discussing her son's deformed foot; begins, "I was favored with your letter some time ago ..." - · To John Hanson, solicitor: 4 items: -- 1 autograph check signed: 31 May 1803: (B'ANA 0654): from Nottingham: 1 page (single sheet): for £27.18.0 to go to Messrs. Wright & Co. -- 1 autograph check signed: 18 Jul 1804: (B'ANA 0687): from Southwell: 1 page (single sheet): for £50 to go to W. Cheetham. Mounted on leaf following p. 10 in v. I of the grangerized copy of Nichol's Byron. -- 1 autograph letter signed: 20 Sep 1804: (B'ANA 0531): from Southwell: 1 page (double sheet): wanting half of address leaf; begins, "You will be so good as give Byron fifteen pounds..." -- 1 autograph letter signed: 25 Jun 1805: (B'ANA 0653): from Southwell: 3 pages (double sheet): begins, "I have this day drawn on you for eighty pounds at three months date...".
- To Frances Leigh, her sister-in-law: 1 autograph letter signed: 27 Mar 1791: (B'ANA 0081): from Aberdeen: 2 pages (double sheet): begins, "I received your letter some time ago and would have answered it sooner but do not like to make you pay so much for postages of letters that I am sure can not amuse you ..." - To James Watson, Writer to the Signet, her legal agent in Edinburgh: 1 autograph letter signed: 11 Nov 1787: (B'ANA 0737): 1 page (double sheet): from Paris: written during the last months of her pregnancy; begins, "I have drawn upon you for the sum of Three Hundred pounds at two months which is the time that Lord Aberdeens Bond becomes due ...".
