- To Lord Brougham, British lawyer, statesman and Lord Chancellor: 1 autograph letter signed: 10 Feb 1841: (MISC 0572): asking to be excused from Lord Cardigan's murder trial.
- To Lady Elizabeth Foster, later Duchess of Devonshire: 13 autograph letters signed: -- 25 Jan 1805: (MISC 0556): regarding Sir John Moore's defeat in the Iberian peninsula, etc. -- [1806]: (MISC 0557): regarding Lord Erskine's bill against cruelty to animals. -- 25 Apr 1808: (MISC 0558): mostly regarding the "Rochfort Squadron." -- 10 Jul 1808: (MISC 0559): expressing his approval of the affairs in Spain. -- 12 Aug 1808: (MISC 0560): thanking her for her "good news"; believing that "we shall soon hear that Lisbon is taken ..." -- 9 Oct 1808: (MISC 0561): regarding his illness; also "I am indeed very sorry that the Hollands are going to Spain..." -- 5 Feb 1809: (MISC 0562): regarding the Battle of Corunna, also

on the Mary Anne Clarke scandal. -- 24 Feb 1809: (MISC 0563): more on the scandal involving the Duke of York and Mrs. Clarke. -- 15 Aug 1809: (MISC 0564): regarding the war in Europe. -- 17 Nov 1809: (MISC 0565): congratulating her on her marriage; more about the war. -- 20 Dec 1810: (MISC 0568): mentioning friends, Lady Grey, and the war in Portugal. -- 10 Aug 1811: (MISC 0569): condolences upon the death of the Duke of Devonshire. -- 2 Dec 1811: (MISC 0570): regarding mutual friends.

- To George Lamb, politician and writer: 1 autograph letter signed: 3 Oct 1819: (MISC 0571): declining to subscribe to the aid of "the poor people who have suffered at Manchester" (in the Peterloo Massacre); giving reasons.
- To "Mon cher Comte": 1 autograph letter signed: 25 Dec 1809: (MISC 0567): in French; with 19th c. manuscript English translation in an unknown hand; on the state of the British government.
- To an unknown recipient: 1 autograph letter signed: 20 Dec 1809: (MISC 0566): on his improving health, and the "late defeat in Spain"; also: "The country is going to the devil as fast as it can ...".
