- To Anthony Galignani, bookseller and publisher : 1 autograph letter signed : [late 1830?] : (B'ANA 0552) : begins, "I am confined to the house by cold otherwise I should have called to see if your copy of Ld. B[yron] had arrived ...".
- · To William Galignani, bookseller and publisher: 2 letters: -- 1 autograph letter third person: [ca. late 1829]: (B'ANA 0547): from Hôtel des lles Britanniques, Rue de la Paix: wanting to meet to discuss a "matter of business connected with Mr. Moore's Life of Ld. Byron." -- 1 autograph letter signed: [late 1830?]: (B'ANA 0554): including, "I shall have great pleasure in making acquainance with M. Bertin ...".
- · To A. and W. Galignani, booksellers and publishers: 4 autograph letters signed: 1 Dec 1829: (B'ANA

0548a): from Hôtel des Iles Britanniques: a list of questions relating to his Voyages and Travels. Along with a draft response, apparently in the hand of one of the Galignanis (B'ANA 0548b). -- 18 Dec 1829: (B'ANA 0549): from Paris: begins, "I have just received a joint letter from Mr. Moore & Mr. Murray requesting me to apply to you for the sheets of Mr. Moore's Life of Byron ..." -- 17 Sep 1830: (B'ANA 0551a): from 27 St. James' St., London; including more relating to Moore's Life of Byron. Along with a draft response from the Galignanis (B'ANA 0551b). -- [late 1830?]: (B'ANA 0553): begins, "I return your Volume which looks very well ...".

• To "My Dear Sir" (either A. or W. Galignani): 2 autograph letters signed: -- 6 [Jan?] 1830: (B'ANA 0550): relating to his Voyages and Travels. -- [late 1830?]: begins, "As I have made some slight changes to my letter to Mr. [John] Murray, I shall be glad if you will read it over ...".
