Abstract: M. A. Hookham, née Starling, friend and correspondent of Mary Hays. Before turning twenty-one she married a Mr. Hookham, some time between April and October of 1820. It is possible that she is Mary Ann Hookham, author of *The Life and times of Margaret of Anjou, queen of England and France* (1872). To Mary Hays, writer : 3 letters : -- 1 autograph letter signed "M. A. Starling" : 1 Dec 1819 : (MISC 2199) : from Brewer Street; discussing the works of Mary Wollstonecraft; begins, "Allow me to assure you it is with no small pleasure that I accept your kind offer of correspondence ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed "M. A. Starling" : 24 Apr 1820 : (MISC 2200) : from Marlborough Square; begins, "Being well acquainted with my Mother's reluctance to letter writing ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed "M. A. Hookham" : 6 Oct 1820 : (MISC 2205) : from Marlborough Square; begins, "I fear, my dear Madam, you will attribute to neglect and want of friendship my silence on the part of my Mother and myself ...".
