- To William Hoare, Esq. at no. 3 Powis Place, Great Ormond Street: 1 autograph letter signed: 3 Dec 1799: from Leicester Square; begins, "Your invitation for so remarkable a day, and with such early notice, does me particular honour ...".
- To Amelia Opie, novelist and poet: 1 autograph letter signed: 7 Dec [1809?]: (O'ANA 0008): including remarks about Godwin; begins, "I thank you so much for your letter, and especially for your consideration in telling me the secret of Mr. Barbauld's death ..." Published in Brightwell's Memorials of the Life of Amelia Opie (1854), p. 138-9. Mounted in the Pforzheimer Collection's grangerized copy of Brightwell's Memorials; shelved with oversized manuscript volumes.
- To an unidentified "Sir": 1 autograph letter signed: [w/m = 1807]: (MISC 4099): begins, "I should have acknowledged the favour of your Letter much sooner, but that I have been ambitious to add a few observations, in compliance with your request, to that vast catalogue of facts which you have so charitably produced ...".
