The Memoir by the Countess Guiccioli, in remembrance of the Poet of 'Childe Harold' has been received with pleasure ..." Mounted within the letter is a clipping from the 1 Sep 1869 issue of the New York Herald, a letter by Johannes to the editor, defending Byron against Stowe's accusations; also included are two contemporary newspaper clippings praising Johannes's defense of Byron.
