- To James Perry, journalist : 1 autograph letter third person : "Tuesday" [Aug 1812] : (MISC 0845) : from Cadogan House; saying she would be obliged if he would "call on her any day this week...".
- To Anna Maria Porter, novelist: 4 letters: -- 1 autograph letter signed: "Sunday": (MISC 2297): from Bushey; begins, "Accept my best thanks for your very kind attantions..." -- 1 autograph letter signed: 19 Feb [w/m = 1796]: from Bushey Park; saying "the comedy she thinks has much merit -- but Mrs. Jordan has determined never again to perform a new character in Men's clothes ..." -- 1 autograph letter third person: [no date]: (MISC 2299): begins, "Mrs. Jordan has to apologize to Miss Porter for not sooner

requesting her acceptance of admissions for the Theater ..."-- 1 autograph letter signed: "Saturday" [w/m = 1805]: (MISC 2300): from Bushey; begins, "When I tell you that the Duke has for some days been sincerely ill I am confident I shall claim more than your pardon for my seeming neglect ...".

- To "My ever dear old friend" : 1 autograph letter signed : "Sunday" : (MISC 0846) : from Wolverhampton; begins, "I rec'd your last night -- and grieved to perceive by it, that you have been so unwell ...".
- To "My dear sir" : 1 autograph letter signed : "Monday" [w/m = 1808] : (MISC 0296) : from Bushey; begins, "I should be sorry the letters I have inclosed to you were the only [works?] I could produce ...".
