This collection documents the career of Maya Plisetskaya, Prima Ballerina Assoluta. The collection spans the years 1956-1990. It consists of correspondence, clippings, photographs, slides and negatives.

## **Biographical Note**

Maya Plisetskaya was born in Moscow in 1925, the oldest in a family of three children.

In 1932 the family was sent to Spitzbergen off the coast of Norway, in the Artic Circle, where her father worked for Arktikugal (Arctic Coal). Plisetskaya returned to Moscow by herself in ca. 1934, so that she could study ballet. The rest of her family returned to Moscow in the summer of 1935. On April 30, 1937 her father was arrested. This was the last time she saw him, and in 1989 she learned that he had been executed by firing squad January 7, 1938. Her mother was considered an enemy of the state because of her husband and was arrested in 1937 while pregnant with their youngest child. She was finally released and returned to Moscow in April 1941.

Plisetskaya graduated from school June 21, 1941. She began her professional life in ballet the next day, the same day that Germany invaded its former ally the Soviet Union. The family evacuated to Sverdlovsk in September that same year. At some point Plisetskaya left (without permission) and returned to Moscow and her ballet studies. A second set of examinations and graduation were held in March 1943. She passed. But admission into the Bolshoi contained endless petty harassments from envious colleagues and party officials.

She was refused permission to tour with the company for six years, but in 1959 was finally permitted to tour in the United States of America. She eventually performed all over the world.

Plisetskaya married the Russian composer, Rodin Shchedrin, on October 2, 1958. The couple had no children.

Plisetskaya travels the world extensively lecturing and performing. She was director of the Theatro Lirico National de España. In 1991, King Juan Carlos of Spain awarded her the Gold Medal of Fine Arts. In 2000 at the Bolshoi's gala celebrating her 75<sup>th</sup> birthday, President Vladimir Putin presented her with Russia's highest civilian honor, the medal for service to the Russian state, second degree.

She and Shchedrin currently live in Herradura, Spain.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The Maya Plisetskaya papers span the years 1956-1990 and consist of correspondence, clippings, photographs, slides and negatives.

Alice Vrbsky, a fan of Maya Plisteskaya, created the collection. Vrbsky made scrapbooks of Plisetskaya's career. The correspondence is from Plisetskaya to Vrbsky and is all in Russian as Plisetskaya did not learn English. The clippings are mostly from North American publications, although there are foreign language clippings also included. There are equal amounts of publicity photographs and candid shots of both ballet productions and Plisetskaya playing the part of a tourist. Vrbsky also took the slides and negatives.

The collection is important in its documentation of the Cold War era career of Maya Plisetskaya, who danced in several tours with the Bolshoi Ballet. The collection does not have any personal anecdotes from either Vrbsky or Plisetskaya.

#### Series I: Correspondence, ca. 1968-1972

1 Folder

This series consists of correspondence from Maya Plisetskaya to Alice Vrbsky. There are letters, postcards and greeting cards. All correspondence is in Russian.

### Series II: Photographs, 1958-1988

4 Boxes

This series consists of photographs, slides and negatives. The majority of this series consists of ballet performances, with limited photographs about life off stage.

#### Sub-series 1 – Stills, 1958-ca. 1988

90 folders

This sub-series consists of photographs from ballet performances by Maya Plisetskaya. Some photos are publicity stills, some taken by professional photographers and snapshots. Also included are photos of Plisetskaya away from the ballet, including her home and family. There are also prints from slides and/or films. The majority of the photographs are black and white.

#### Sub-series 2 – Slides and Negatives, 1959-1987

48 folders

This sub-series consists of slides of ballet performances by Maya Plisetskaya. There are also slides of Plisetskaya away from the stage.

### Series III: Programs, 1956-1990

1 Box

This series contains programs from performances of Maya Plisetskaya and the Bolshoi Ballet. Some are in languages other than English.

## Series IV: Clippings, ca. 1962-1966

This series contains clippings. There are reviews of performances of Maya Plisetskaya and the Bolshoi Ballet. There are also "human interest" stories about Plisetskaya's life away from the ballet.
