The collection was processed and cataloged in 2006.

Biographical Note

David Sears was a writer on modern dance. He graduated from New York University where he received a teaching degree. He wrote for *Dance News* and *Ballet Review* as well as other lesser-known publications. At the time of his death he was working on a book on Martha Graham and her use of Greek themes in her choreography. He died on June 24, 1992.

Scope and Content Note

The David Sears papers document his research process for articles and reviews about dance. The collection consists mainly of New York area newspaper clippings in a wide range of topics related to both dance and theater. In addition there are press releases and stock photographs from several organizations. There is also some material related to college and English as a Second Language courses taught by Sears among the limited professional papers.

The collection is organized into 3 series and 2 sub-series. They are:

Series I: Professional Papers

4 Boxes

This series contains professional material including correspondence and receipts. There is also material used in teaching courses at both Hunter College and Queens College. Because Sears was involved with the puppet community, there is material from puppetry guilds in the New York City area. Also included are his reviews that appeared in the magazine *Michael's Thing*, as well as other regional magazines.

Series II: Research Material

47 Boxes

This series contains dance and theater-related clippings from newspapers and magazines in the New York City area mainly from the *New York Times* and *The Village Voice*. Also included are press releases and stock photographs. In addition there are handwritten notes.

Sub-series 1 – Dance 35 Boxes

This sub-series contains dance-related clippings from newspapers and magazines in the New York City area mainly from the *New York Times* and *The Village Voice*. Also included are press releases and stock photographs from dance related organizations in the New York City area. When Sears attended performances, his notes used to write reviews are included in the folders. There is also an extensive section of material based upon the work of Joseph Campbell. This material was used for research for the proposed book about Greek influences used in Martha Graham's choreography. He was working on this book at the time of his death.

Sub-series 2 – Theater 12 Boxes

This sub-series contains theater-related clippings from newspapers and magazines in the New York City area mainly from the *New York Times* and *The Village Voice*. These folders are mostly about playwrights and directors. There are extensive reviews and essays about the career of playwright and actor, Robert Ludlam, who used puppetry in his theatrical productions. Also of note is research material based on plays by Shakespeare and George Bernard Shaw.

Series III: Oversized Material
