## Creator History

Lincoln Edward Kirstein (1907-1996) was a patron of the arts and writer, best known for his influence on the development of ballet in the United States. He co-founded the New York City Ballet, and served as its general director from 1948 to 1989. Kirstein wrote extensively on dance and art.

Martin B. Duberman (b.1930) is a historian and playwright who taught history in universities for over fifty years. He is the author of many biographies, including *The Worlds of Lincoln Kirstein*.

## Scope and Content Note

This collection contains the first and second pass page proof manuscripts of the biography, *The Worlds of Lincoln Kirstein*, written by Martin Duberman in 2007. Minimal handwritten notes from editors are present on both versions of the manuscript. The second pass manuscript files also include a letter from Alfred A. Knopf publishers explaining changes from the earlier version.

**Arrangement:** Collection is divided into two parts: first pass page proof manuscript in box 1; second pass page proof manuscript in box 2.
