#### Surveys of materials by or relating to prominent individuals

#### G-H

Surveys list all of the materials (which we happen to have located) by or relating to a specific individual throughout the Division's collections. Surveys have been compiled in a variety of formats and to different levels of detail. At minimum a survey provides the names of the collections containing correspondence or other material by or about an individual.

Surveys are not guides to complete collections of an individual's papers. The materials listed are, in most cases, not filed or shelved together, but are scattered throughout the Division's collections.

The surveys are not comprehensive: they are meant to serve as a time-saving device. Researchers are encouraged to check the guides to other collections that may prove fruitful for their research as the survey files have not been rigorously updated in recent years; researchers are also encouraged to ask Division staff, in person or via <a href="massref@nypl.org">mssref@nypl.org</a>, for reference assistance.

To request material listed in a survey it will usually be necessary to consult the guides to the collections listed in order to identify the box number or volumes that contain the material by or relating to the subject of the survey. Some finding aids are available on the Division's website, but many are only available in paper format in the division's reading room. Division staff will be able to assist readers translate the information in a survey into a request for material.

In many cases the surveys were compiled in order to complete a microfilm order of all the material by or relating to an individual. In these cases copies of the microfilm (or paper copies made from film) can be ordered.







by President Hoover in 1929. In 1930 Hoover designated her as delegate to the International Prison Conference in Prague, but her final illness prevented her from attending. She died of chronic myocarditis at her home in the Framingham reformatory in 1931, at the age of sixty-four. After an Episcopal service, her body was cremated.

The papers of Jessie Hodder in the Schlesinger Library, Radcliffe College, are a valuable source for the study of her personal life, her reform ideas. and the evaluation of her by contemporaries; they do not contain the bulk of her administrative correspondence. There is important material also in the Elizabeth Glendower Evans Papers at the same library; see especially Sanford Bates to Raymond Moley, June 4, 1935 (Folder 87), Mrs. Evans to Miriam Van Waters, Jan. 14, 1932 (Folder 94). and Folders 59a, 59b, and 59c. The most valuable printed sources are her annual reports as Superintendent of the Reformatory for Women in Framingham, Mass., published from 1912 to 1915 as part of the Annual Report of the Board of Prison Commissioners and from 1916 to 1930 in the Annual Report of the Bureau of Prisons. HOCE, Jane Currie Blaikie (July 31, 1811–Aug. 26, 1890), Civil War relief leader, church and welfare worker, better known as Mrs. A. H. Hoge, was born in Philadelphia, Pa., the

daughter of Mary (Monroe) and George Dundas Blaikie. Her father, a trader at 8 North Front Street in 1811, was apparently an East India shipping merchant. Later he was with Blaikie, Mills & Company, but by 1843 he had become secretary of the Philadelphia, Wilmington & Baltimore Railroad. His ancestry was Scottish, his wife's English. Their daughter, Jane, studied music and is said to have graduated, at the head of her class, from the Young Ladies' College in Philadelphia, a classical school operated by a Harvard graduate, John Maitland Brewer.

On June 2, 1831, she was married to Abraham Holmes Hoge (1799-1890), a native of Washington County, Pa., and a merchant in Allegheny Town, near Pittsburgh. They had thirteen children, of whom eight reached maturity. In September 1848, after seventeen years in Pittsburgh, Hoge moved his family to Chicago, Ill., where he opened an iron works in association with Philetus W. Gates, although he retired from business a few years later. From 1849 to 1868 he was an elder of Chicago's North (later Fourth) Presbyterian Church, During their stay in Pittsburgh, Mrs. Hoge had joined the First Presbyterian Church and had acted as secretary of the Pittsburgh Orphan Asylum. In Chicago she was a founder, in 1858, and the ruling spirit of the Home for the Friendless, a refuge for destitute widows and children. Here she met Mrs. MARY A. LIV-ERMORE, a recent arrival from the East who also served on the home's board.

Upon the outbreak of the Civil War, when two of her sons enlisted (one, George Blaikie Hoge, became a brigadier general), Mrs. Hoge began relief work by helping to care for the sick of her son George's regiment at Camp Douglas in Chicago. Soon she and Mrs. Livermore were lending a hand in the work of the Chicago (later Northwestern) Sanitary Commission, organized in the fall of 1861 with Mrs. ELIZA CHAPPELL PORTER as director, which undertook to forward hospital supplies contributed by local aid societies to the sick and wounded of the Western armies. Mrs. Hoge and Mrs. Livermore were also appointed agents of DOROTHEA L. DIX, general superintendent of army nurses, in recruiting qualified women for hospital duty in the West, a service which they continued to the end of hostilities.

In March 1862 the two women had their first close view of war when at the request of Sanitary Commission officials they visited the military hospitals at Cairo and Mound City, Ill., filled with casualties of the battle of Fort Donelson, in order to investigate reports of misappropriation and waste of Sanitary sup-

plies and to suggest ways in which the commission might better prepare for the wounded of future battles. Touring also the hospitals of the Western Sanitary Commission at St. Louis, they returned to Chicago with a vivid impression of the soldiers' sufferings and needs and with valuable suggestions for improving procedures. That November they were persuaded to leave their families to attend a "Women's Council" of leaders in Sanitary work, called in Washington, D.C., by the United States Sanitary Commission to discuss ways of stimulating public confidence and support at a time of general discouragement and apathy. Upon their return home Mrs. Hoge and Mrs. Livermore were appointed associate directors of the Chicago branch and opened a vigorous campaign to increase contributions of money and supplies. Through letters, visits, and talks to women's gatherings all over the Northwest, they inspired flagging aid societies and set up new ones, until over a thousand groups were making regular shipments to the Chicago headquarters; by the end of 1863 the flow of bedding, clothing, hospital equipment, medical supplies, and articles of diet to supplement army rations had increased fourfold (Newberry, p. 221).

Meanwhile each of the women made at least one trip to the fighting front for a firsthand view of the end of their supply line. In January 1863 Mrs. Hoge started downriver to visit Grant's army at Young's Point, opposite Vicksburg. Before she reached Memphis, however, her riverboat was commandeered for an expedition against Confederate forts on the White River in Arkansas. It proved a bloodless campaign, but for a fortnight Jane Hoge nursed measles and pneumonia cases among soldiers crowded into the boat's long cabin, providing from her stores the only hospital supplies and sick diet available. Ten days after her return to Chicago she set out again for Young's Point, where for two weeks, through a pouring rain, she toured the tents and hospitals of Grant's army, encamped in a swamp behind the levee. Bringing back news of widespread incipient scurvy, Mrs. Hoge launched an emergency drive throughout the Northwest for contributions of vegetables; many later insisted that this prompt action had "saved the army." She made her last trip to the field in June, this time to besieged Vicksburg on one of the personal errands of mercy characteristic of the day, nursing her gravely wounded colonel son in his tent, visiting hospitals in the rear and rifle pits on the front lines, and finally bringing her son home in a dispatch boat under fire from Confederate guerrillas.

That summer Mrs. Hoge and Mrs. Livermore began work on a new project to fill the commission's treasury-a great Sanitary Fair for Chicago. With a backlog of money and salable articles which Jane Hoge secured from friends in Pittsburgh and Philadelphia, they called a meeting of delegates from the aid societies in September and through them galvanized the Northwest into action. The fair, opening in Chicago at the end of October 1863, proved a gala two-weeks' wonder, clearing over \$70,000. At a second Women's Council, held at Washington in January 1864 to concert efforts for the great campaigns ahead, the Chicago fair was a central topic. Well briefed by Mrs. Hoge and Mrs. Livermore, the Sanitary leaders went home to organize a fair in every major city of the North, culminating in a second one for Chicago. At the conclusion of hostilities Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton complimented Mrs. Hoge for "her great services in alleviating suffering." Dr. Henry Whitney Bellows, president of the United States Sanitary Commission, described her as "ten women rolled into one." "She was a practical woman," said her colleague Mrs. Liver-more, "and her executive ability was very marked. Her power of patient, persistent work was seemingly limitless. Her force of character was irresistible, and bore down all opposition. Her energy was simply tremendous. She excelled in conducting a public meeting, and was a very forceful and attractive public speaker" (My Story of the War, p. 160).

While wartime memories were still fresh, Mrs. Hoge, at the request of "gentlemen of eminence," took up her pen to recount her experiences. The Boys in Blue (1867) was offered as a tribute to the common soldier and to his womenfolk at home, who in the work of the Sanitary Commission had "managed and controlled . . . an amount of business heretofore considered impracticable" for the sex. During the postwar years, although in poor health, she undertook some educational and religious work. In 1871, as president of the Women's Educational Association of Evanston, Ill., where the Hoges were then living, she directed successful fund-raising efforts to establish the Evanston College for Ladies, with FRANCES E. WILLARD as president. Mrs. Hoge served on its board of trustees until 1873, when the college was absorbed by Northwest-ern University. "Massive alike in form and feature," in the words of Miss Willard, Mrs. Hoge had a "hearty and contagious enthusiasm. . . . Anything that helped women she was ready for." In 1872 she was chosen to head the Woman's Presbyterian Board of For-

Abraham Hoge, who during the war had helped out at the Sanitary Commission office, between 1870 and about 1877 held a post as storekeeper in the federal internal revenue service. An unsuccessful attempt, led by Frances Willard in 1878, to secure appointment as postmistress of Evanston for Mrs. Hoge suggests a period of straitened circumstances. Jane Hoge died in Chicago in the summer of 1890, a few months after her husband, at the age of seventy-nine; the attending physician recorded the cause as a fracture of the hip and old age. She was buried beside her husband in Graceland Cemetery, Chicago.

HOKINSON, Helen Elna (June 29, 1893-Nov. 1, 1949), cartoonist, known for her gentle caricatures of middle-aged clubwomen, was bom in Mendota, Ill., the home of her maternal grandparents. She was the only child of Adolph and Mary N. (Wilcox) Hokinson. Her father, a large, gregarious man, had emigrated from Sweden, where the family name had been spelled Haakonson. He had been a blacksmith in Moline, Ill., before joining the Moline Plow Company as a salesman of farm machinery. Her grandfather Wilcox, a native of Ohio, was known in Mendota as an orator and politician. Helen's mother had graduated from a local business college, where she gave a commencement address tartly defending women's right to participate in "practical business." The

Hokinsons lived comfortably in Moline and Des Moines, Iowa, during Helen's childhood and in 1905 settled in Mendota.

Helen's early school career, perhaps delayed by illness, was undistinguished. In the Mendota High School, however, she ranked in the top quarter of her class, played basketball, drew caricatures for the yearbook, and compiled a book of sketches of her classmates. After graduation in 1913 her parents at first discouraged her plan to attend the Chicago Academy of Fine Arts, but consented when another Mendota girl was found to accompany her. She was enrolled at the academy for five years (1913-18), her courses including cartooning, illustrating, and layout procedures. During this period she began a career in commercial design and for several years sold fashion sketches to such major Chicago department stores as Marshall Field and Carson Pirie Scott and to several agencies. Life in Chicago was largely uneventful for Helen Hokinson-except, perhaps, for the evenings when Edgar Lee Masters, a neighbor, dropped in to read his poetry. She lived at the Three Arts Club and shared a studio with Alice Harvey (later Alice Harvey Ramsey), a fellow designer and cartoonist. In November 1920 the two young women moved to New York City and took up lodgings at the Smith College Club.

In New York, Miss Hokinson continued her work in fashions, taking on accounts from Lord and Taylor, Altman, and other department stores; she also tried her hand, briefly, at a comic strip for New York's new tabloid, the Daily Mirror. Pursuing her study of art, she took a class at the New York School of Fine and Applied Art with the painter Howard Giles, a disciple of Jay Hambidge's theory of "dynamic symmetry," a principle of design that she came to regard as fundamental to her work. Losing interest in fashions, she began to sketch garbage collectors, snow shovelers, and coal men. She spent two or three summers in the Adirondacks, painting landscapes of the kind that later appeared in her New Yorker covers.

In 1925 she submitted some sketches to Harold Ross, who that year published the first issue of the New Yorker, and was immediately absorbed into the circle of special contributors whom Ross pampered and scolded, criticized and adored. Her first New Yorker cartoon appeared in November, depicting a bemused matron shopping for perfume ("It's N'Aimez Que Moi, madam—don't love nobody but me"). Together with James Reid Parker, with whom sher collaborated after 1931 (previously the editors of the New Yorker supplied the captions for most of her drawings), she contributed to mod-
