#### **BIOGRAPHY**

William Dawson Bridge (1840-1926), shorthand inventor, author and professor of shorthand at Chautauqua University, New York. Published works include: A New and Rational System of Shorthand Numbers (1886).

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The Collection contains five manuscript volumes (dates unknown) which belonged to Bridge at one time. The volumes are lecture notes in a shorthand system which has not been identified, but which may represent the one he invented and may possibly have been written by Bridge himself. These notes were taken from lectures by various individuals on diverse topics: pheumatology, ethics, christianity, electricity and government.

The name "Daniel Washbourn" is inked on the upper right front page on many of the volumes, with dates between 1793-1794. The significance of this in unknown.

The collection was given to the New York Public Library in 1928 by the National Shorthand Reporters Association.
