Abstract:	The Richard Plant Papers document the literary activity and academic career of the author and educator best known for his book <i>The Pink Triangle</i> (1986), a study of the persecution of homosexuals in Nazi Germany. The collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts, typescripts, research files, news clippings, personal papers, printed matter, photocopies, photographs and audio recordings. Materials are in German and English.
Access:	The collection is open for research. Original audio and video recordings contained in Boxes 35-36 are unavailable for research for preservation reasons, as of October 2001. Service copy duplicates of the original recordings are being made and will be available soon.

Biographical Note

Author and educator Richard Plant was born Richard Plaut in Frankfurt, Germany on July 22, 1910. His father was a doctor, a Socialist and a Jew who in 1933 convinced his only son to flee Nazi persecution by moving to Switzerland. Plant enrolled at the University of Basel, where he was awarded a Ph.D. in languages in 1935. He contributed film criticism to Swiss and German newspapers, wrote a novel for children, Die Kiste mit dem Grossen 'S' (1936), and published a volume on cinema, Taschenbuch des Films (1938). In 1938 he emigrated to the United States (where his surname was changed to "Plant") and settled in New York. Plant acquainted himself with prominent émigrés, including the philosopher Paul Tillich, and resumed his career as a writer and teacher. During World War II he served as a translator in the Office of War Information. He later wrote film criticism, book reviews and essays that appeared in *The New Yorker*, *The New York* Times Book Review, The Saturday Review, The Nation and several German-language periodicals. The Dragon in the Forest, a novel based on his youth in Germany, was published in 1948. Plant collaborated with the composer Jack Beeson and the writer Elmslie Howard to produce the opera *Lizzie Borden*, which premiered at City Center in 1965. He taught German language and literature at The City University of New York from 1947-1973, and also lectured at The New School for Social Research during the 1960s-1970s. After his retirement from teaching, Plant devoted himself to a study of the persecution of homosexuals by the Nazi regime. He published numerous articles on the subject, as well as a definitive monograph, The Pink Triangle (1986). Richard Plant died in New York City in 1998.

Scope and Content Note

The Richard Plant Papers document the literary activity and academic career of the author and educator best known for his book *The Pink Triangle* (1986), a study of the persecution of homosexuals in Nazi Germany. The collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts, typescripts, research files, news clippings, personal papers, printed matter, photocopies, photographs and audio recordings. This material is in German and English, and spans from 1916 to 1998. The papers provide insights on the life and work of a representative German émigré scholar who was a pioneer in the field of gay history. A substantial portion of the collection relates to Plant's extensive research and writing about the lives of gays in Germany during the 1930s-1940s. There is also material that documents his work as a film critic, literary scholar, translator and lecturer, as well as his role in the composition of the opera *Lizzie Borden* (1965). The Richard Plant Papers are a valuable source of information on Nazi persecution of homosexuals, the historiography of the Third Reich, 20th-century German literature and gay politics and culture in the United States.

Series Descriptions

SERIES I. CORRESPONDENCE, 1948-1998

BOXES 1-3

Richard Plant's correspondence files contain incoming and outgoing letters, postcards and miscellaneous enclosures. The majority of items are written in English, but there are as well substantial numbers written in German, Plant's native language. Topics discussed include the author's historical research, his academic career, his writings and his personal affairs. Prominent correspondents include composer Jack Beeson, author Heinrich Böll, sociologist Rüdiger Lautmann, historian Hugh Trevor-Roper and gay activist Ian Young. The files contain a great deal of information related to Plant's study of the persecution of homosexuals in Nazi Germany and the composition of his book on the subject, *The Pink Triangle*. Particularly important in this regard are letters exchanged with Rüdiger Lautmann, Albert de Cocatrix, Jim Steakley and Ian Young. There is also material relating to Plant's collaboration, with Jack Beeson, on the composition of the opera *Lizzie Borden*, and his work as editor and translator of the German writers Heinrich Böll and Marie Luise Kaschnitz.

SERIES II. WRITINGS, 1926-1996

BOXES 4-14, 39

This series contains published and unpublished writings by Richard Plant including short stories, critical essays, newspaper and magazine articles, histories, translations, memoirs, and novels, as well as several folders of sketches, outlines and fragments. Writings are in English and German, and are arranged alphabetically by the title of the work, when known. Many folders contain correspondence, news clippings and printed material gathered by Plant in the course of his research for the project concerned. There are also reviews, newspaper clippings and promotional materials regarding several of Plant's most important works, including Lizzie Borden and The Pink Triangle. The earliest items date from Plant's student years in Germany and Switzerland. They include papers written for university classes, dramatic sketches, short stories and film and book reviews. After his emigration to the United States in 1938, Plant authored book, film and theatre reviews that appeared in *The Saturday Review*, *The Nation* and numerous German-language publications. This series includes dozens of examples of these critical essays, many of which focus on German literature of the 1940s-1960s. In addition, there are several reviews that appeared during the 1970s-1980s in The Advocate and Christopher Street regarding new titles in the field of gay history. Examples of Richard Plant's work as a novelist include a photocopy of the printed edition of The Dragon in the Forest (1948) together with dozens of reviews of the book, and a typescript of the unpublished *Mimosa*. There is important material relating to Richard Plant's collaboration, with composer Jack Beeson and writer Elmslie Kenward, on the composition of the opera *Lizzie Borden* (1965), including drafts, outlines, research notes, promotional material, reviews, librettos and vocal scores. These items are complemented by correspondence regarding the opera

contained in Box 1 Folder 22. During the 1970s-80s Plant devoted himself to a study of the persecution of homosexuals in Nazi Germany. This series contains numerous essays, newspaper articles and notes on the subject, as well as typescripts, galley proofs and reviews of Plant's monograph *The Pink Triangle* (1986).

SERIES III. LECTURES AND SPEECHES, 1949-1991

BOXES 15-16

These files contain typescripts, outlines, research notes, news clippings and promotional material for classroom lectures and public speeches given by Richard Plant during the 1950s-1990s. Many undated items appear to be from the 1960s-1970s. The bulk of the material is in English, but there are as well a few items in German. Folders are arranged alphabetically in title order. Subjects of Plant's public speaking include prominent German authors, gay history, Nazi Germany and the experience of European émigrés to the United States. Several files on the subject of homosexuals, the Holocaust and Nazi Germany contain materials directly related to Plant's published writings on these subjects.

SERIES IV. RESEARCH FILES, 1920s-1990s BOXES 17-31, 39

Filed here are materials gathered by Richard Plant in the course of his research for numerous writing and teaching projects. The alphabetically arranged files document Plant's research methods and his broad reading on subjects including 20th-century German literature and history, the Nazi regime's persecution of homosexuals, and gay culture in the United States. Included are research notes, news clippings, journal articles and books, photocopies and printed ephemera. Many items are annotated by Richard Plant, and several of the books contained in boxes 25 and 26 are inscribed by his friends and colleagues.

SERIES V. PERSONAL PAPERS, 1940-1990s

BOXES 32-34

This small series of miscellaneous papers contains address and appointment books, resumes, interviews and biographical portraits of Richard Plant and genealogical information regarding his ancestors and relatives.

SERIES VI. PHOTOGRAPHS AND ARTWORKS, 1916-1980

BOXES 37-38

Filed here are photographs of Richard Plant, his family and friends, and a sculptural collage made by an unidentified artist on the subject of the opera *Lizzie Borden*.

SERIES VII. AUDIO-VISUAL RECORDINGS, 1949-1995 BOXES 35-36

Included are audio recordings of interviews of Richard Plant, in German and English, an audio recording of the opera *Lizzie Borden* and a video recording of the documentary film *Pink Triangles* (1982), which includes footage of Richard Plant. Original audio and video recordings contained in Boxes 35-36 are unavailable for research for preservation reasons. Service copy duplicates of the original recordings are available for most of these items.
