MISS FRANK E. BUTTOLPH. PAPERS

Miss Frank E. Buttolph, who had friendly relations with the New York Public Library for many years, died of pneumonia at Bellevue Hospital on Wednesday, February 27, 1924.

In 1899 Miss Buttolph inquired whether the library would preserve some then current menus. Upon the Director of the N.Y.P.L. agreeing, Buttolph began an extensive worldwide search for memorable specimens. Miss Buttolph continued to collect menus until the time of her death.

The papers of Miss Frank E. Buttolph, 1900 - 1921, consist of correspondence relating to Miss Buttolph's search for and acquisition of menus for her collection. The sorted material (there are two flat boxes that have not been sorted) is in chronological order and primerally incoming. There is correspondence with other collectors with whom she exchanged menus, stamps and postcards and many acknowledgments of gifts. Some letters in French and German. Included also are some mounted prints of menu covers and a minimal amount of personal correspondence.
