Description

Maria Silliman Church (1810-1880) was the daughter of Professor Benjamin Silliman Sr., widely known physicist who founded "The American Journal of Sciences and Arts." Miss Silliman married a large landowner in Conn., Mr. John Barker Church, in the year 1830. She spent her time rearing and educating her seven children.

The collection consists mainly of correspondence written during the years 1829-1858. Approximately half the letters are to and from her parents, Harriet and Benjamin Silliman Sr. of New Haven. Another quarter is correspondence with her husband and the rest are to and from a wide range of other family members. Maria maintained a close and up to date relationship with family and friends even though there was always distance between them and personal problems were not always easy to phrase on paper. In spite of this the letters offer a detailed portrayal of how difficult dayto-day life could be. We learn of the many moments of happiness, the births, illnesses and deaths this family endured during these years.
