The German opera composer Richard Wagner had married Cosima Von Bülow (born Liszt), his second wife, in 1870. Liszt"), Bayreuth, 1876 May 15 (probably copied in another hand) ; envelope in which documents were contained when sent by Mrs. Baumgarten to Mrs. Burrell.
