Biography/History

George Cochrane Hazelton, actor and playwright, was born January 20, 1868. He performed as an actor with Lawrence Barrett, Edwin Booth, and Madame Modjeska. His first attempt as a playwright was *The Raven* about the life of Edgar Allen Poe. His next play, *Mistress Nell*, was written in 1900 and was a great success. His most well-known play was *The Yellow Jacket*, which he coauthored in 1912 with Benrimo. *The Yellow Jacket* was performed around the world by a number of notable actors including Mr. and Mrs. Charles Coburn and Harpo Marx. Hazelton died in New York on June 24, 1921.

Scope and Content Note

The George Cochrane Hazelton Scores consist of orchestra parts for plays written by Hazelton, though the identity of most of the composers is unknown. The plays were not musical and so scores are of the occasional music used in the work. Of note is the music included for the Edwin Booth production of *Hamlet*. Other music includes two additional songs, one inscribed to George C. Hazelton, Jr., the other with no known relationship to Hazelton.

Series I: Productions, ca. 1890-1941

This series contains score parts for plays either written or performed by George Hazelton. The composers are unknown with the exception of *The Yellow Jacket* composed by William Furst. Included are *Hamlet*, *Mistress Nell, The Raven* and *The Yellow Jacket*. Of special note is the music for *Hamlet* that is from the Edwin Booth production.

Series II: Individual Scores, ca. 1898-1940

This series contains 2 pieces of handwritten music. One piece, by Hubbard T.Smith entitled "Swinging in the Grapevine Swing" is inscribed to George C. Hazelton, Jr. The other piece, much later, may not have any relationship to Hazelton and is entitled "You Call it Madness but I Call it Love."
