# **Biographical Note**

John Watts was born July 16<sup>th</sup>, 1930. He received his BA from the University of Tennessee, his Masters in Musicology from the University of Colorado and completed doctoral studies at the University of Illinois and Cornell University. Some of his teachers included Cecil Effinger, Roy Harris, John Krueger, Robert Palmer, Burrill Phillips and David Van Vactor.

In 1950 Watts entered military service and served for two years as a clarinetist, dance band pianist and arranger in the 75<sup>th</sup> and 179<sup>th</sup> Army Bands, Special Services. After this he taught briefly at the Army-Navy Music School in Washington, DC. During this time he married his first wife, Mary.

He held many teaching positions over the years including posts at the University of Colorado, North Dakota State College, International Institute of Music, Puerto Rico, and Staten Island Community College. He was also the editor of the *Manhattan East* newspaper, a graphic designer and a free lance writer.

In the fall of 1964, Watts founded the Composers Theatre, and in 1966 he became the president of its parent organization, the Composers and Choreographers Theatre. In 1969 he became a member of the faculty at the New School for Social Research in New York. Watts was the director of the ARP Electronic Music Program, and the Music Workshops coordinator. During this time Watts met and married his second wife, Laura Foreman.

Over the years Watts produced over 100 compositions in all forms, primarily chamber music and dance scores. He also had an interest in children's theater. Starting in 1969 Watts began to incorporate electronic elements into his compositions, and became an adept ARP synthesizer soloist. His works and performances helped to popularize the electronic synthesizer as a musical instrument.

John Watts died on July 2, 1982 at the age of 52.

# Scope and Content Note

The John Watts Papers contain documents from 1947 to 1981 and cover the professional musical career of the composer, John Watts. The correspondence includes letters between Watts and his friends and colleagues and letters between Watts and his first wife, Helen. The grant materials contain applications for various federal and private grant programs, not only for personal work but on behalf of the Composers Theater. Watt's teaching materials include class lists, flyers, grades and other materials pertaining to the Composers Theater, such as handwritten lecture notes. The writings consist of papers Watts completed for various publications, as well as research for several of his compositions. The collection is primarily scores and includes many of Watts' compositions, both published and unpublished, sketches and drafts. Of special note are the "environmental" scores, collages created by Watts and meant to be played intuitively by instrumentalists. With the exception of the correspondence, the collection is lacking in materials of a personal nature.

#### Series II: Grant Materials, 1969-1976 1 box

Arrangement: Alphabetical

Includes applications for various federal and private grant programs, not only for personal work but on behalf of the Composers Theater as well. Both successful and unsuccessful applications are represented.

### Series III: Teaching Materials 1969-1975 2 boxes

Arrangement: Alpabetical

Contains class lists, flyers, grades and other materials pertaining to the Composers Theater, as well as lecture notes.

## Series IV: Writings and Research 1953-1976 1 box

Arrangment: Alphabetical

Includes papers Watts completed for various publications and forums, as well as research for several of his compositions.

#### Series V: Photographs, 1971 1 box

Arrangement: Subject

Photographs of the Composers Theater gatherings in 1971. Includes both group shots and individual pictures of Watts.

## **Series VI: Scores, 1949-1981** 10 boxes

Arrangement: Alphabetical by title.

Scores composed by Watts. Includes many rough sketches and undated pieces. Also includes "environmental" scores – collages meant to "move" musicians to play.
