Abstract: David McAdams was an African American former social worker who became director of the Ford Foundation's Institut Politique Congolais in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (formerly Zaire) in 1961, and later director of the Peace Corps in the Ivory Coast (1966). The David McAdams Africa collection primarily consists of printed material, reports, articles, news summaries, news clippings, and press releases, many of which are in French, on the former Republic of the Congo (formerly Zaire), the Ivory Coast, and Angola. Additionally there is some correspondence. Some papers relate to Patrice Lumumba and his organization, the Mouvement National Congolais, and others concern Moise Tshombe, the Katanga Secession, and the United Nations peacekeeping mission in the Republic of the Congo.
