The Aldridge family papers consisting of copies of birth, marriage, and death certificates, and correspondence to and from Ira Aldridge and other family members. The scrapbook has been disbound and includes photocopies of articles and playbills featuring *The African Roscious*, *Othello*, *Macbeth*, *The Slave*, *Obi*, *the Ethiopian*, *The Death of Christophe*, and a booklet *Ira Aldridge*, *American Negro Tragedian and Taras Shevchenko*, *Poet of the Ukraine: Story of a Friendship*, published by Marie Trommer, 1939.
