appeared in the Harry Belafonte film *Beat Street*, the Joseph Papp and Oxfam America "Lifeline to Africa" concert, and at the Caribbean Cultural Center's "Festival 1984", to name a few.

Scope and Content Note

The Rejoicensemble Collection contains programs, brochures, musical scores, and a published book on the basics of learning to play gospel music on piano by Carl MaultsBy. The material spans from 1985 to 2010, and it is organized chronologically. The programs in the collection correspond with some of the scores, all of which were commissioned for the Rejoicensemble Company.
