Source: The bulk of this collection was donated by Alan Mandell in 1973 at the closing of the Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center. Small additions were made between 1974 and 2012.

Abstract: The Actor's Workshop and Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center records contain the administrative and production records of the two companies, and document the creative output and operational activities of directors Jules Irving and Herbert Blau, and manager Alan Mandell.

The Actor's Workshop was a San Francisco-based professional theater company, founded by Jules Irving and Herbert Blau that presented experimental and classic productions from 1952 to 1966. In 1965, Irving and Blau became the artistic directors for The Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center, a fledgling theater company with the goal of presenting plays of social and emotional significance in a repertory format. Longtime collaborator and theater manager Alan Mandell accompanied Blau and Irving to the Repertory Theatre.

This collection contains both companies' administrative files, correspondence, photographs, play critiques relating to the companies' play selection process, production files, publicity materials, and set and costume designs. Additionally, the collection houses the Jules Irving papers, which contain files concerning his involvement in other companies and a collection of scripts.

Creator history

Actor's Workshop

The Actor's Workshop (also known as the San Francisco Actor's Workshop) was a professional theater company established in 1952 by San Francisco State University professors Jules Irving (1925-1979) and Herbert Blau (1926-2013) and their respective wives, Priscilla Pointer (born 1924) and Beatrice Manley (1921–2002). The company provided a forum for actors to hone their craft by performing challenging plays, while providing San Francisco audiences with avant-garde, as well as more traditional, theatrical productions.

Initially, the Actor's Workshop was run and staffed by volunteers, with Irving, Blau, and later Robert Symonds directing the productions and Alan Mandell serving as business manager. The troupe grew from giving small invitation-only events in 1952 to producing plays simultaneously at the 630-seat Marines Memorial Theater and the 140-seat Encore Theater by 1959. Though most of the company's productions were held in San Francisco playhouses, in 1957 they brought their acclaimed production of Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot to San Quentin Prison. In 1959, they also performed Waiting for Godot at the Brussels World's Fair and the York Playhouse in New York.

The company specialized in contemporary dramas, such as Arthur Miller's The Crucible and Jean Genet's The Balcony, while also producing standard repertory plays, including Aristophanes' Lysistrata and Shakespeare's King Lear, Twelfth Night, and The Taming of the Shrew.

The Actor's Workshop was the first West Coast theater to sign an Equity "Off-Broadway" contract. The company secured funding from the Ford Foundation's "Program for Playwrights" in 1959, which allowed the group to pay staff members and attract established actors. Blau and Irving left the Actor's Workshop in 1965 to co-direct the newly established Repertory Theater of Lincoln Center in New York City. Financial problems forced the Actor's Workshop to disband in 1966.

Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center

The Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center (hereafter referred to as Repertory Theatre), housed at the ANTA-Washington Square Theater and ultimately the Vivian Beaumont Theater, was a theater company founded with the goal of presenting plays of social and emotional significance in a repertory format. The company was conceived in 1960 as an independent, non-profit theater and was recognized as the newly-conceived Lincoln Center's constituent in the dramatic arts. Robert Whitehead and Elia Kazan were appointed the first producing directors. In 1962, a training program for actors was instituted under the supervision of Robert Lewis.

Although the Vivian Beaumont Theatre did not officially open until the summer of 1965, Repertory Theatre proceeded with its plans for a 1963-1964 season. A temporary facility, the ANTA-Washington Square Theatre was erected at 40 West 4th Street on land donated by New York University. The temporary theater had a similar seating plan and stage design to the proposed Vivian Beaumont theater, allowing both the artists and subscribers to experience continuity after the move. Arthur Miller's After the Fall was their inaugural production. In January of 1965, Jules Irving and Herbert Blau were appointed directors of Repertory Theatre and moved directly into offices in the new Vivian Beaumont Theater, bringing with them Actor's Workshop colleagues Alan Mandell, Cheri Landry, and others. In the ensuing reorganization, a workshop program was begun for the company and included classes in mime under Carlo Mazzone-Clemeni and voice coaching by Henry Jacobi.

During its run, the theater produced both classics such as The Miser (1969) and new, groundbreaking works such as The Disintegration of James Cherry (1970). Other notable productions include The Caucasian Chalk Circle (1966) and In the Matter of J. Robert Oppenheimer (1969).

In February 1966, a supporting membership group, The Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center Guild, was formed to create a broad-based support for the Theater and to disseminate information to the public.

Herbert Blau resigned as co-director of Repertory Theatre in 1967, with Irving continuing as the sole director. The company opened the smaller, experimental Forum Theater in the fall of 1967, with the presentation of Mayo Simon's two new one-act plays, Walking to Waldheim and Happiness.

Repertory Theatre continued its program of outreach, launching a High School Program as well as a generous student ticket policy. In the 1970s, the company encountered financial difficulties, primarily due to a decrease in giving and the rising costs of operating the Vivian Beaumont Theater. Ideas were floated for sharing the space during the dark part of their season, bringing in more outside groups, and even for presenting popular musicals instead of more experimental fare.

At the Repertory Theatre's November 1972 board meeting, Jules Irving submitted his formal resignation, stating that he wished to be relieved of his duties at the close of the 1972-1973 season. The Forum season was to be curtailed due to financial difficulties. The board created a special committee to recommend an administrative and artistic reorganization of the theater, but ultimately, the Repertory Theatre played its final performances in 1973.

Scope and content note

The Actor's Workshop and Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center records contain the administrative and production records of the two companies, and document the creative output and operational activities of directors Jules Irving and Herbert Blau, and manager Alan Mandell.

The Actor's Workshop records contain administrative files; correspondence; production records, publicity files, and set and costume designs that document the group's performances; and scripts and play critiques relating to the company's play selection process. These records span from the formation of the Actor's Workshop in 1952 to the departure of Irving, Blau, and Mandell in 1965.

The Jules Irving papers document some of Irving's activities outside of his official roles at the Actor's Workshop and Repertory Theatre. The series consists of a small run of personal files that include educational documents, correspondence with outside theatre groups, speeches and writings, photographs, and other miscellany; papers relating to the San Francisco Children's Theater; and a script collection.

The Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center records hold administrative files, correspondence, fundraising documents, High School Program materials, production files, and publicity materials. These records had been partially processed more than once in the past. All efforts were made to retain original order while working around the initial processing. This is especially evident in the correspondence series, where a loose date arrangement as well as a subject arrangement had been created out of the original alphabetical correspondence run.

Original catalogue numbers (starting with preface 8-MWEZ + n.c. or MWEZ + n.c.) appear as notes in the container list.

Series I: Actor's Workshop Records, 1947-1965 (52 boxes, 1 volume) This series documents the management of the Actor's Workshop, as well as the company's production and publicity decisions. Files are organized by department and document type into six subseries: A. Administrative Files, B. Correspondence, C. Production Records, D. Publicity Department, E. Scripts and Critiques, and F. Set and Costume Designs.

I. A. Administrative Files, 1952-1965

Administrative Files consist of the Actor's Workshop's organizational and business records. These files include alphabetical subject files (covering a variety of topics such as the San Quentin performances and Weekly Bulletin newsletters), incorporation documents, employee and actor contracts, financial records, fundraising and grant materials, and tour planning and logistic documents. Correspondence in this subseries include contact with outside theater organizations, communications with the United States State Department concerning foreign officials visiting the company, and letters and surveys to subscribers. Also of interest is a guest book that contains signatures and comments from audience members for the years 1955 and 1956.

I. B. Correspondence, 1953-1965

The Correspondence subseries contains incoming and outgoing letters relating to the company's management and artistic activities. The majority of the letters are to or from Jules Irving, Herb Blau, Alan Mandell, and Secretary Cheri Landry. Letter writers include actors and agents, advertisers, audience members, community theater enthusiasts and supporters, funding organizations, playwrights and other collaborators, reporters and reviewers, television and radio stations, and theater managers from across the country, among others.

The subseries, which contains files maintained by multiple staff members, is organized into two arrangements: by date and by individuals and organizations. Either section could contain items from specific letter writers or related to specific topics; researchers should consult both sections.

I. C. Production Records, 1953-1965

The Production Records subseries is comprised of general files, consisting of casting notes, correspondence, miscellaneous programs, stage manager reports, and other records; and production files that document individual plays. The majority of the production files contain cast lists, letters concerning the play, and rehearsal schedules, while the best documented plays also have promptbooks, annotated scripts, design illustrations, lighting and sound cue diagrams, set-change diagrams, wardrobe and prop checklists, and various other performance notes. The files for The Birds include the musical's piano/vocal score. The Friedman and Son files included two reel-to-reel tapes, labeled "Mono" and "Stereo." Before processing, the production files were loosely arranged alphabetically, instead of by season.

I. D. Publicity Department, 1953-1965

This subseries documents the promotion of Actor's Workshop productions. The publicity department, headed by Bart Benedict, dealt with advertising, public relations, and general marketing of the plays and the company's actors. These files include mock-ups of newspaper and magazine advertisements, biographies of actors, photographs, posters, scrapbooks, and scripts for radio advertisements on KCBS San Francisco.

The bulk of the section consists of performance photographs and publicity portraits of company actors in costume. The photographs are organized chronologically by season and then alphabetically by play title. Photograph formats include glossy 8" by 10" images and contact sheets (often labeled "proofs" or "galleys"). While the bulk of these items are black and white, the 1957-1958 production Tiger at the Gates includes some color photographs. Occasionally play fliers, posters, programs, and letters with photographers are filed along with the photographs. Also present are three scrapbooks, notably one documenting the Actor's Workshop after Irving and Blau's departure for the Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center.

I. E. Scripts and Critiques, 1958-1965

The Scripts and Critiques subseries contains material related to the Actor's Workshop's process for reviewing scripts for performance consideration. These documents include correspondence with playwrights, critiques written by Actor's Workshop reviewers, and scripts. Also present are some carbon copy replies from Irving, Blau, and Actor's Workshop secretary Cheri Landry.

The Play Critique section contains folders of critiques separated from their accompanying scripts, while the Scripts and Critiques section features files in which the script and critique were kept together.

Submissions came from professional and amateur playwrights from across the country. The critiques contain a brief plot synopsis and an evaluation of the play, and note the play's title and author, name of the critic, and dates that the script was submitted and returned. The process of reading and returning rejected manuscripts often took more than a year. Many of the scripts present in the collection were returned to the company from the post office and marked as undeliverable.

Beginning in 1963, the Actor's Workshop coordinated with the Theatre Communications Group, who paid Actor's Workshop members to critique amateur plays through their Script Reading Program.

The Jules Irving papers consist of biographical records concerning his education and career; some of Irving's writings and speeches; files documenting his involvement in other projects, such as the National Theatre Conference, the Theatre Communications Group, and the Free Southern Theatre; papers relating to the San Francisco Children's Theater; and a script collection. Irving wrote original musicals for the San Francisco Children's Theatre: these materials consist primarily of copies and drafts of scripts. Irving's script collection holds scripts from San Francisco Actor's Workshop productions, Repertory Theatre productions, and unrelated scripts. Some scripts have notes and memos attached.

Series III: Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center Records, 1958-1973 (228 boxes)

The Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center records hold administrative files, correspondence, fundraising documents, High School Program materials, production files, and publicity materials.

The administrative files reflect the business, financial, legal, and organizational concerns of the company, as well as the files of producing director Robert Whitehead. Correspondence documents the day-to-day business of the company, including outreach to playwrights (such as Arthur Miller), the optioning of future productions, scheduling and season planning, union negotiation, and the brainstorming of artistic and technical hires.

Fundraising and ticket sales holds fundraising materials as well as box office and subscription reports. The company's High School Program records demonstrate the Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center value of educational outreach. Their High School Program sent professional actors into local high schools and middle schools to present short programs of drama.

The production files detail each season and production mounted by the company. It holds photographs, scripts, programs, promotional posters, set designs, and stage manager reports. The Publicity Department files hold actor bios, advertising mock-ups, headshots, press releases, and other documents relating to marketing and outreach for the theater.

III. A. Administrative Files, 1963-1973

The administrative files reflect the business, financial, legal, and organizational concerns of the company. These files include minutes and reports from Board of Directors meetings, company policy and rosters, and contracts.

The employment files hold correspondence from prospective actors, directors, stage managers, and others wishing to secure a position with the company. When the company opened there was a great surge of interest from actors wanting to train in a repertory environment. These letters often include a headshot and résumé. There are also headshots and résumés submitted without correspondence.

The facilities files include plans for the temporary ANTA-Washington Square Theater, as well as photographs from Lincoln Center's groundbreaking. Files relating to bookings, insurance, operating costs, rentals, and security are also contained here.

The theater's financial files consist of cash disbursements, earnings, payrolls, and expense reports, among other materials. There are gaps within many of these documents.

This subseries also contains readers' reports on submitted scripts, organizational files, union negotiations, and dealings with the Lincoln Center for Performing Arts, Inc., the overseeing organization of the Lincoln Center complex.

The Robert Whitehead files reflect the work of the theater's first producing director, who was involved from the theatre's conception in 1958 through 1965. They consist of his correspondence, materials relating to the design and development of Lincoln Center, personal production files, notes, memos, and board minutes.

Schlosser, and assistant to the directors Hugh Southern.

III. C. Fundraising and Ticket Sales, 1963-1973

This subseries holds fundraising materials as well as box office and subscription reports. The fundraising materials consist of donor correspondence both with one-time and long term donors, as well as grant applications to various organizations, and files relating to both the Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center Guild and the Repertory 500.

As a non-profit theatre, the company depended heavily on grants and giving. In February 1966, a supporting membership group called the Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center Guild was formed to create broad-based support for the Repertory Theatre and to disseminate information to the public. The Repertory 500 drive was established in 1970 to encourage giving. The goal of this program was to attract 500 members to give \$1000 a season in exchange for benefits such as access to rehearsals and opening night galas.

This subseries also contains the weekly box office receipts for each production, as well as subscription reports for each season. The box office correspondence includes returns, comp requests, and issues and problems that arose with ticketing.

III. D. High School Program, 1965-1973

The Repertory Theatre of Lincoln Center valued educational outreach, and their High School Program sent professional actors into local high schools and middle schools to present short programs of drama. The theater also provided educators and students with free or reduced-price tickets to productions at Lincoln Center.

The High School Program subseries holds correspondence, performance reports, schedules, travel documentation, and analyses of various schools as appropriate venues for the program. These records document a sharp learning curve, as those running the program quickly discovered what would and would not be effective in an inner city school, what would hold the student's attention, and what to do when faculty and staff were not prepared to assist the program in any way. The performance reports and the school evaluations are a play by play for each individual school visit and are of great interest.

III. E. Production Files, 1963-1973

Subseries E, Production Files, detail each season and production mounted by the company. Included are photographs, scripts, programs, posters, set designs, and stage manager reports.

Productions are arranged by season and opening date and, after the opening of the Forum Theater in 1967, by theater. Canceled and postponed productions are included and these are noted at the folder level. The amount and content of the files varies by production.

The general files found under each production are diverse in content, and may include programs, notes, cast sheets, scene breakdowns, costuming, music, prop lists, correspondence, lighting and sound design, fly cues, and understudy lists.

Photograph files may contain both contact sheets and full sized images, and include costume calls, production shots, and rehearsal images. Scripts may include various drafts of production scripts, marked operating scripts, stage manager's scripts, and those used for music and lighting cues.

The stage manager reports provide a snapshot of every performance for the run of a show. The stage managers noted which actors were out and which understudies were on, any problems that occurred during the performance, their opinion of how the cast performed certain scenes, notes for further rehearsal when there were problems, and the audience's size and reaction to the show. There are often related rehearsal reports.

These files were catalogued at an earlier date and some sections or folders have corresponding call numbers. These are noted in the finding aid. The location of oversize material is noted at the folder level.

This subseries holds 18 audio reels, mostly sound effects and music for specific productions.

III. F. Publicity Department, 1958-1973

The Publicity Department files hold actor bios, advertising mock-ups, headshots, press releases, and other materials relating to marketing and outreach for the theater. This department was headed by Publicity Director Susan Bloch. The actor bios consist of forms filled out by each actor (and in some cases, directors or technical theatre employees) for use in programs and production publicity. Advertising mock-ups are hand made designs in various stages of development that eventually led to posters and other signage used around the theater. The headshots contained in this subseries were collected for use in publicity, and some are marked for cutting or reproduction. They are arranged alphabetically by actor's last name.

Publicity photography, including audience shots, theater interiors, and photographs of the directors and board are here. There are also copies of formal press releases, programs, and tour publicity materials.

The scrapbooks are arranged by date, with some overlap. These hold clippings related to individual productions such as reviews, as well as the development of the theater as a whole. The clippings also document staff resignations and appointments, biographies of actors, gossip mentions, and promotional pieces about the Lincoln Center complex.

Most of the scrapbooks were catalogued at an earlier date and that identifying number has been maintained when apparent.

This subseries contains one video reel from MGM-TV, an informative presentation on the Repertory Theatre that was part of a series that detailed the institutions within Lincoln Center.
