Creator History

Belle Baker (circa 1893-1957) was an American actress and singer. Her niece, Marilyn Cooper (1934-2009), was an actress. Baker was a ragtime and torch song singer and vaudeville actress. Among her best known songs are "My Yiddishe Mama," "Blue Skies," "I'm Sorry I Made You Cry," "My Man," and "My Kid." She performed with the Ziegfeld Follies, on Broadway, in silent films, and for the radio show *The Eveready Hour*.

Marilyn Cooper, primarily a Broadway actress, made her stage debut in *Mr. Wonderful* in 1956. Other Broadway credits include *Golden Rainbow*, *Two By Two*, *Woman of the Year*, and *Broadway Bound*. She also appeared in film and on television.

Scope and Content Note

The Belle Baker and Marilyn Cooper collection (1912-1970) contains photographs, scores, clippings, and sound recordings. The collection also contains three painted fashion designs, a script excerpt for "This is Your Life," a souvenir journal for a Belle Baker testimonial dinner, and two published booklets: *The Secretary's Job* and *The Singer's Job*, the latter of which was written by Cooper and Baker. Photographs are headshots, portraits, and snapshots of Baker with friends and colleagues at events. Scores are for "That Mellow Melody" and "I'm Sorry I made you Cry. Sound recordings document songs sung by either Cooper or Baker.
