## **Creator history**

Anne Bronaugh, born in 1887, in Nicholasville, Kentucky, was an American actress in the early 20th Century. She was a leading lady of the Winnipeg Stock Company (also known as the Winnipeg Permanent Players) at the Winnipeg Theatre from 1913 to 1919. She was the original Rosemary in *Abie's Irish Rose* on Broadway, 1922-1923. She also worked with the Somerville Players, the F. James Carroll Company and the Bandbox Players in Hempstead, New York. She taught acting for the National Council of Jewish Women.

In 1942 she moved to Penn Yan, New York into a cottage on Keuka Lake. After retiring from acting she worked for the Corning (NY) Chamber of Commerce.

Bronaugh died on October 22, 1963 in Hammondsport, New York and is buried in the Pleasant Valley Cemetery.
