INTRODUCTION

The Carolyn Leigh Collection was donated to The New York Public Library, Billy Rose Theatre Collection in September 1987 by Ms. Leigh's sister, June Silver. The material included sound recordings (15 boxes), published and unpublished music scores (1 transfile), scrapbooks (22 books), calendars (12 books), artistic papers (63 metal book files), and business and personal correspondence (1 transfile). The recorded material has been turned over to the Rodgers and Hammerstein Archives of Recorded Sound; the music scores have gone to the Music Division.

The manuscript material was retained in the Billy Rose Theatre Collection and has been arranged in five series totaling thirteen linear feet. The papers were in good condition and relatively good order. The files have been maintained as nearly as possible in their original order and with their original title. Papers within files have been put in chronological order. Two linear feet of printed and duplicate material were removed from the collection.

BIOGRAPHY

Carolyn Leigh, well known lyricist, was born Carolyn Rosenthal in The Bronx, New York, 21 August 1926. She graduated from Hunter College High School in 1944 and subsequently attended Queens College and New York University. She worked as a typist, advertising copywriter and secretary while writing in her spare time.

In 1951 Ms. Leigh, having dialed a wrong number, reached by chance a music publisher who, as a result of the phone conversation, looked at her work and signed her to a contract to write lyrics. That same year Ms. Leigh published her first song, "I'm Waiting Just for You" with Henry Glover. The song was recorded by Lucky Millinder (King) and became a best seller six years later when recorded by Pat Boone. (Dot)

In 1953 Ms. Leigh was given a tune written by California jazz arranger Johnny Richards for which to write a lyric. After three hours of work, she had completed "Young at Heart," which was recorded by Frank Sinatra and became a smash hit, staying on the charts from February to June of 1954. The song attracted the attention of Mary Martin who liked it so much that she asked Ms. Leigh to write the lyrics for the new show that she and her husband, Richard Halliday, were planning. The show was Peter Pan. It was

a smash hit and played in houses across the country, on television, and in 1979 returned to Broadway starring Sandy Duncan.

"Young at Heart" and Peter Pan began a period of artistic achievement and financial success. In 1955 Ms. Leigh collaborated on four musicals produced for television by Max Leibman, The Merry Widow, The Chocolate Soldier, Heidi, and The Great Waltz. By 1959 Ms. Leigh had written some thirty songs including Witchcraft which was recorded by Frank Sinatra and won five Grammy awards for him.

In 1960 Carolyn Leigh, now an established lyricist, returned to Broadway with <u>Wildcat</u>, produced by Michael Kidd and starring Lucille Ball in her Broadway debut. <u>Little Me</u> followed in 1962.

How Now Dow Jones in 1967 marked the beginning of a new phase in Ms. Leigh's career in which she extended her talents into new areas. She began to originate ideas for new shows (including How Now Dow Jones); she worked on a lyrics primer and drafted a humor book and a diet book; she drafted lyrics for an autobiographical production titled Forty-Eight; she lectured at the 92d St. Y series 'Lyrics and Lyricists' and performed her own works at the Ballroom in 1976 and at Michael's Pub in 1980. Her performances received rave reviews. Ms. Leigh also formed her own company, Carwin Music, which published many of her songs, including the score for How Now Dow Jones.

Ms. Leigh continued her creative work to the end of her life in 1983. Notable works during this late period were Something to Do: A Salute to the American Worker (1976) commissioned by the U.S. Department of Labor, Hellzapoppin (1976) and Smile, a workshop production, which opened at the Union Square Studio shortly before Ms. Leigh's death from a heart attack on 19 November 1983 at Lenox Hill Hospital, New York.

Carolyn Leigh was 57 when she died. She had been married three times: to Julius Levine from 1947 to 1959, to David Cunningham from 1959 to 1968, and briefly to Jim Bodine in 1970. She had no children. Her lifetime achievement as one of America's foremost lyricists was honored posthumously when she was inducted into the Songwriters' Hall of Fame in 1985.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTES

The Carolyn Leigh Collection, 1944-1985, comprises five series: I. Artistic Papers, 1951-1984 (7½ linear ft.); II. Legal Records, 1948-1985 (1 linear ft.); III. Papers, 1944-1985 (1½ linear ft.); IV. Scrapbooks, 1951-1983 (22 books, 2 ft.); and V. Calendars, 1961-1983 (1 linear ft.). The papers span Ms. Leigh's entire professional life and provide a remarkably vivid picture of her career, her creative processes, and her personal life.

Series I Artistic Papers, 1951-1984.7½ linear ft. (18 boxes)

This series, arranged alphabetically, includes notes, drafts of lyrics, scripts, outlines, meetings notes, correspondence, clippings, and production records. These papers provide information about the development of ideas for shows and the evolution of lyrics from early drafts to the finished product. They also provide a glimpse of Ms. Leigh's method of approaching creative problems: that is, collecting background information, jotting down words, phrases and rhymes, and writing and rewriting a lyric.

All of Ms. Leigh's produced musicals are documented: Peter Pan (1954), Wildcat (1960), Little Me (1962), How Now Dow Jones (1967), Something to Do (1967), and Hellzapoppin (1967). Less completely documented are her television productions, Heidi, The Merry Widow, The Great Waltz, and The Chocolate Soldier all in 1955 and I'm a Fan in 1972. Many unproduced shows and shows completed by other artistic teams, notably Smile, are also documented. In addition to musicals, there are drafts for books, lecture notes, and scripts for Ms. Leigh's appearances as a lecturer and performer. The lyrics for a musical, Forty-Eight, and a draft for a diet book, The Thin Book, contain important biographical information.

Ms. Leigh filed a small amount of correspondence concerning productions with the artistic material and these items have been retained there. However, the bulk of correspondence concerning shows will be found in the Papers, 1944-1985 series and the Legal Records, 1948-1985 series. Press releases, clippings, and messages from well wishers on opening nights will be found in the Scrapbooks, 1951-1983 series.

Note that shows which fill an entire record box are listed at the end of the series. Thus, <u>Caesar's Wife</u>, <u>Flyers</u>, etc., follow <u>You're Nobody</u> til Somebody Loves You.

Series II Legal Records, 1948-1985. 1 linear ft. (2 boxes)

This series, arranged alphabetically, includes correspondence, financial statements, account records, and clippings. The Agency folders contain correspondence, contracts, and negotiations with music publishers. The Financial/Legal folders, arranged chronologically, contain information about royalties and receipts as well as about Ms. Leigh's personal financial condition and her attorneys' programs for helping her manage her money. The file folder "Lawsuit - Ankle" includes Ms. Leigh's medical history in addition to information about the suit itself.

Series III Papers, 1944-1985. 14 linear ft. (3 boxes)

This series, arranged alphabetically, includes greeting cards from and correspondence with friends, family, associates, and professional organizations.

Correspondence with collaborators and associates concern professional as well as personal matters. Many of these letters include discussions of career opportunities and artistic and other problems with shows being developed. The correspondence with Ruth Dickson, a school friend and writer (Married Men Make the Best Lovers, 1967 and Marriage is a Bad Habit, 1968), includes personal information about both Ms. Leigh and Ms. Dickson. Correspondence with Mr. Cunningham is often very informative as well. Much of Ms. Leigh's correspondence is written with the wit and humor one might hope to find in a writer of musical comedy.

Note that some of this material is restricted, and its usage requires prior permission from the donor.

Series IV Scrapbooks, 1951-1983. 22 books (2 linear ft.)

The scrapbooks contain clippings, programs and messages from well wishers on the opening of shows. Listings of show receipts from Variety and Billboard listings of top pop hits make up a significant portion of the clippings, particularly in the early years. The clippings in the scrapbooks are in rough chronological order and trace Ms. Leigh's career from her first published song to her death. See the chronology of the major personal and artistic events of Ms. Leigh's life to determine which book a particular event might be located. References to such successful works as "Young at Heart" and Peter Pan continue throughout the books.

Series V Calendars, 1961-1983. 1 linear ft. (3 boxes)

This series is made up of appointment calendars that list appointments, meetings, and expenses and one calendar that lists income from 1969-1983.
