**Abstract:** The manuscript and photograph collection of James Stewart Morcom and John William Keck contains a scrapbook, newspaper and magazine clippings, photo albums, photographs, theater programs, souvenir brochures, playbills, theater journals, and a copy of a 32-page oral history transcript. The majority of the collection pertains to Radio City Music Hall.

### **Creator History**

James Stewart Morcom (1906-1988) was a stage designer who served as the fifth Art Director for Radio City Music Hall.

James Morcom came to New York in 1926 and, from the following year until 1931, worked at the newly built Roxy Theatre as assistant to scenic designer Clark Robinson. When Robinson became the second Art Director for the new Radio City Music Hall in 1933, Morcom again assisted him before moving on to other projects. During the Depression Morcom designed display windows, created backdrops for the Columbia Burlesque theater chain, contributed designs to various plays, night club revues, and films, and also found work with the Federal Theatre Project. In 1936 Morcom worked in London on *Cochran's Coronation Revue*. After returning to the United States and seeing Orson Welles in the title role of Doctor Faustus in his Mercury Theatre stage production of the Marlowe play, Morcom contributed designs to several Mercury productions, including *Five Kings, Too Much Johnson*, and *Native Son*. During World War II he served in the Special Service Arts Department, designing sets and costumes for productions in Paris and London. After post-war study at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts in London, Morcom returned to New York where, after contributing designs to Billy Rose's Diamond Horseshoe and the New York City Ballet, Morcom became Art Director of Radio City Music Hall in 1950. He was succeeded in the position in 1973 by John William Keck.

John William Keck was born in Greenwich Village, New York City, on December 4, 1929. He attended the High School of Music and Art and attended Pratt Institute. Keck got his start as a summer stock scene painter in the 1950s, and eventually became a respected scenic designer. Keck was a designer for several years at Radio City Music Hall before he succeeded James Stewart Morcom as Art Director in 1973. He resigned from the position in the spring of 1980, and later designed sets for the Metropolitan Opera House.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The manuscript collection of James Stewart Morcom and John William Keck includes papers and photographs that chart the professional careers of the two designers.

Both Morcom and Keck held the post of Art Director for Radio City Music Hall in New York, and the majority of the collection relates to their respective tenures. Also included are papers and photographs documenting work by each man for other institutions, such as Morcom's designs for the Roxy Theatre, Morcom's and Keck's designs for Jones Beach Theatre productions, and Keck's designs for the Nolan Scenery Studios and the Metropolitan Opera House. The papers of the Morcom and Keck collection includes newspaper and magazine clippings, souvenir brochures and programs, playbills, journal articles, a transcript of Morcom's oral history of his work with the Federal Theatre Project, and Morcom's personal scrapbook. The subject content of the Morcom and Keck photograph collection inclues costume and production scenes at various venues, publicity photographs, images of scenery being constructed, and Keck's career in summer stock. The dates for the papers and photographs of Morcom are 1926 to 1982, and the dates for Keck are 1948 to 1994. This collection also contains a sizeable set of color and black & white photographs of Radio City Music Hall productions that date from 1933 to 1978. Most photographs include descriptive information on production, performers, date, etc.

Sub-series 2 - Personal Scrapbook 1926-1978 (1 box)

The scrapbook includes newspaper and magazine clippings, programs, playbills, photographs, and related material chronicling his professional life as a costume and scenic designer for musical theater. The contents date from 1926 to 1978. This material focuses mainly on Morcom's work experience at, and related news stories about the Roxy Theatre in New York City at Seventh Avenue and 50th Street, the Roxy-Mastbaum Theatre in Philadelphia, and Radio City Music Hall. Newspaper clippings include articles from *The Houston Press*, and many of the clippings and theater programs contain marginalia written mostly by Morcom. Other related items include cast lists, letters, his resume, and numerous photographs of stage designs, professional and publicity photographs.

This series contains correspondence, newspaper clippings, programs, and souvenir brochures related to Radio City Music Hall and Jones Beach Productions. Correspondence includes a "Letter of Agreement" by the Scenic Artist Union to employ Keck at the Music Hall in 1973, and his letter of resignation to Robert Jani in 1980. Sub-series 1 also contains newspaper clippings and magazine articles that document the creation of Radio City Music Hall Productions, Inc. in 1979 and the appointment of the former Walt Disney executive Robert F. Jani as president, and productions at the Metropolitan Opera House.

Sub-series 2 - Photographs 1948-1994 (7 folders)

This series contains mostly unidentified black & white and color photographs of stage and scenic design construction. Image size ranges from 3x3 to 8x10, and dates range from 1948-1994. Locations appear to include summer stock theater. Radio City Music Hall. Nolan Scenery Studios, and the Metropolitan Opera House. Names of photographers include Petrow Studio of Asbury Park, NJ, N. Silverstein of Morristown, NJ, George S. Bolster of Saratoga Springs, NY, Stephen Shapiro, Wendell Kilmer of West Hempstead, NY, Cecil Clovelly of New York City, Winnie Klotz of the Metropolitan Opera Association, and the New York Times. Folder 3 contains one lone black & white photograph with descriptive text written on the back of the image in pencil. Folders 1 & 4 are images of Keck creating sets for summer stock productions and stage sets in 1954. Originally the photographs in folders 4-7 were encased in two green photo albums with adhesive backings and mylar strip overlays. The images were removed from the deteriorating photo albums and sectioned into folders 4-7 in the general order they were organized in the photo albums. Folders 4 & 5 are images from the first green photo album, and folders 6 & 7 are images from Keck's second green photo album. Folder 5 contains water-color drawings of stage designs. Folders 6 & 7 contain images of the Metropolitan Opera House set designs.

Sub-series 1 contains the 1933 photo album of G.S. Eyssell, President of Radio City Music Hall Corporation and Managing Director. Sub-sub-series A consists of (18) photographs that were originally mounted on gold cardboard backing. Sub-sub-series B consists of (59) photographs that were not bound or mounted, but do have descriptive information. Sub-sub-series C are (24) photographs in which almost all the images have no descriptive information, and have only an apparent internal catalog number assigned to them.

Sub-series 1 - G.S. Eyssell Photo Album 1933

The photo album contains (233) 8 1/2 x 11-inch black & white bound photographs of 1933 Radio City Music Hall production images. Photographs show stage designs and costuming. The front of the photo album is labeled "Mr. Eyssell, 1933", and appears to have belonged to G.S. Eyssell, President of Radio City Music Hall Corporation and Managing Director. The photographs were made and stamped by Koll & Pellino Photos. The dates for the images range from January 19th to December 21 & 28, 1933, and are organized in reverse chronological order that repeats images from January to May 1933 twice. Despite the reverse chronological order of the images in the album, the dates and titles of the photographs have been cataloged in the container listing in the order they appear in the album from left to right. Almost every image is marked with a Music Hall catalog number (M.H. --), or a Radio City catalog number (R.C. --) on the front of the photograph. All spellings and dates and/or lack of information, whether correct or incorrect, were preserved. Identifying text on the back of the photographs includes the names of house performers and visiting acts, but this information is not included in the container listing.
