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Abstract: The Manhattan Theatre Club was founded in 1970 by Albert E. Jeffcoat, Margaret Kennedy, Philip Barber and A. Joseph Tandet. In 1972, Lynne Meadow was hired as Artistic Director. In 1975, Barry Grove was hired as Managing Director. Due to their working relationship, one of the most long-standing in the non-profit community, the Manhattan Theatre Club produces "works of the highest quality by both established and emerging American and international playwrights" —e.g. *Bad Habits, Crimes of the Heart, Ain't Misbehavin'*, *The Singular Life of Alfred Nobbs*, and *Frankie and Johnny in the Claire de Lune*.

Correspondence with financial and theatre related agencies, artistic personnel connected with both proposed and produced productions, and with Manhattan Theatre Club staff makes up a considerable portion of this collection. This collection also contains papers that illustrate the practical business of running a theater company such as literary office reports, meeting minutes, and guidelines, as well as a significant amount of production related material including casting information, production reports, programs, and general publicity.

Historical Note

In 1970, "a small group of business and professional people concerned about the lack of serious theater in what was a rather barren New York theater scene" created the Manhattan Theatre Club (Jeffcoat, 1). Inspired by the Arts Theatre Club of London and the Theatre Guild, the objectives set forth by the founding board members (Albert E. Jeffcoat, Margaret Kennedy, Philip Barber and A. Joseph Tandet), and prevalent in its current existence, are: "the close identification of the subscriber audience with the institution—through subscriptions and through the mixing of artists and audiences in social settings; the diversity of entertainment that is required to keep such an audience year after year; and the effort to help breed serious American Theater by providing a non-commercial home for the development of new work and new talent" (Jeffcoat, 4).

Overcoming its need to develop successful fundraising endeavors and hire an artistic director appropriate for its organization—Philip Barber, Nikos Psacharopoulos and Robert Sinkinger were consecutively hired for this position—the Manhattan Theatre Club (MTC) from 1970-1972 produced and nurtured numerous American playwrights at its five-story building (of which it occupied three floors) located at the National Bohemian Hall at 321 East 73rd Street. This location was comprised of three separate theatres: the Cabaret, complete with stage, tables, and licensed bar; Stage 79, a three-quarter-round tiered amphitheatre; and Stage 73, a 174-seat off-Broadway house (1972-1973 Fact Sheet).

In July of 1972, at the age of 25, Lynne Meadow (née Carolyn Meadow; married name Carolyn Meadow Schechtman), directed Anthony Scully's play *All Through the House*. From this experience, an initial three month contract as the new Artistic Director for MTC was offered. Lynne Meadow (graduate of Bryn Mawr and Yale School of Drama student from 1968-1970) accepted the leadership position in September 1972. On June 23, 1975, Barry Grove (Herbert F. Grove II), former general manager for the New Repertory Project at the University of Rhode Island and a graduate of Dartmouth College with high distinction in theater, joined MTC as Managing Director.

By the end of the 1983-1984 season (the final year on 73rd street), in an effort to expand production facilities and earned income, a long range plan was formulated to expand the physical plant. These efforts dissolved into protracted litigation with the Bohemian Benevolent and Literary Association of the City of NY (the owners of the National Bohemian Hall), the unavoidable eradication of the cash reserve and MTC's first budgetary debt. Negotiations to move MTC to City Center started in Oct 1984, and were fully realized in early 1985 [see Bohemian Benevolent and Literary Association of the City of NY files in box 193-198]. Subscriber and single ticket sales demands necessitated MTC's need to expand once again. The Biltmore Theatre, a Broadway house, on 261 W. 47th St, although in need of major renovations, suited the needs of the organization. Manhattan Theatre Club opened at this site in October 2003.

Meadow and Grove's reliance on MTC officers, early recognition of talent, and strong desire to foster artist growth shaped the organization; Jonathan Alper, who started

as Literary Manager (ca 1980) and soon after was promoted to Artistic Associate (1984-1991), had a very strong impact on the organization's artistic direction. MTC created long term associations with numerous playwrights—e.g. John Patrick Shanley, Alan Ayckbourn, Athol Fugard, A.R. Gurney, Stephen Metcalfe, Beth Henley, Terrence McNally, Donald Margulies, Richard Wesley, Richard Greenberg, and Richard Maltby Jr.

MTC's many tributes include fifteen Tony Awards (e.g. Ain't Misbehavin' and Proof), four Pulitzer Prizes (i.e. Crimes of the Heart, The Piano Lesson, Proof and Doubt), 45 Obies (e.g. Children, Bad Habits, Mensch Meier and Frankie and Johnny in the Claire de Lune) and 25 Drama Desk Awards (e.g. Lips Together Teeth Apart, Italian American Reconciliation and Love! Valour! Compassion!), as well as numerous Drama Critics Circle (e.g. Aristocrats and Mass Appeal), Outer Critics Circle (e.g. Loot and After Play) and Theatre World Awards (e.g. Eleemosynary and What the Butler Saw). In addition, the Manhattan Theatre Club has won the Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding Achievement, a Drama Desk for Outstanding Excellence, and a Theatre World for Outstanding Achievement. It is under "the dynamic leadership of Artistic Director Lynne Meadow and Executive Producer Barry Grove" that the Manhattan Theatre Club "has grown in three decades from a prolific Off-Off Broadway showcase into one of the country's most acclaimed theatre organizations" ("About Us" page on the Manhattan Theatre Club website.)

Scope and Content Note

The Manhattan Theatre Club Records document the development of the creative and the business output of this successful off-Broadway theater company. Materials are arranged according to the Manhattan Theatre Club originating divisions of Artistic Files and General Management. Artistic Files refer to files generated by the Artistic departments under the direct supervision of Artistic Director Lynne Meadow. General Management files refer to files generated by the General Management departments under the direct supervision of Executive Producer Barry Grove. Due to the close working relationship between the Artistic Director and the Executive Producer, numerous artistic materials can also be found in General Management series (e.g. production files). As such, similar sub-series can be found under both series (i.e. administration and production files). While comparable documents can be found within these two series (and specifically within the sub-series mentioned), the notes and departmental handling are unique.

Correspondence with financial and theatre related agencies, artistic personnel connected with both proposed and produced productions, and with Manhattan Theatre Club staff makes up a considerable portion of this collection. This collection also contains papers that illustrate the practical business of running a theater company such as box office statements, literary office reports, meeting minutes, and guidelines, as well as a significant amount of production related material including casting information, clippings, production reports, programs, and general publicity.

The collection contains a limited amount of personal correspondence or other personal information about the founders, members, writers, directors, or actors. In addition, the collection contains a limited number of scripts, contracts and production photographs.

In order to maintain Manhattan Theatre Club's designated divisions of Artistic and General Management departments, similar sub-series can be found under both series (i.e. administration and production files). While comparable documents can be found within these two series (and specifically within the sub-series mentioned), the notes and departmental handling are unique.

The Artistic Files contain materials generated by the departments under the direct supervision of Artistic Director Lynne Meadow. The Artistic Departments focused on creating and producing shows and performances as well as developing and maintaining working relationships with authors, artistic and theatrical agencies, and funding organizations. While every decision was ultimately subject to approval by Lynne Meadow and Barry Grove, Artistic Associate Jonathan Alper is credited with his invaluable assistance in shaping the artistic focus of the agency from 1980 until his death in 1990.

Artistic files include show and performance materials related to off-Broadway, Broadway, and Cabaret productions and performances as well as materials related to the *Writers in Performance* series of readings by authors and performers. Materials include correspondence, scripts, casting lists, financial materials, fundraising materials, stage manager reports, publicity, photographs, and clippings as well as resumes of artistic personal, submissions from writers, artists and agents, and professional files created by Artistic department staff. Due to the close working relationship between the Artistic

departments and General Management, assorted management materials can also be found in this series.

Sub-Series I: Artistic Administration Files, 1970-1994 58 boxes Arrangement: Alphabetical

The Artistic Administration Files include all materials related to the Artistic departments of the Manhattan Theatre Club that do not specifically belong in the sub-series of Alper files, Production Files, or Writers in Performance Files. Files contain materials documenting the scope of the Artistic departments as well as the everyday activities necessary to the artistic evolution of the Manhattan Theatre Club. Some files, such as several Organization files, detail MTC staff's involvement in non-MTC related activities and committees.

Materials include correspondence, benefit files, organization files, development information, and financial information, as well as artistic submissions, casting notebooks and personnel resumes. Files also include general administration materials such as schedules, building information and travel information.

Sub-series II: Jonathan Alper files, 1979-1990 14 boxes Arrangement: Alphabetical

The Alper files contain materials related to Jonathan Alper's tenure at MTC. A freelance director who directed 1978s *Safe House*, Alper was hired as Literary Manager in 1980 and was later promoted to Artistic Associate; he is credited as having shaped the artistic focus of the developing agency. Alper attended numerous annual conferences including those of the Humana Festival of New American Plays, the Eugene O'Neil Theater Center's National Playwrights Conference, and the Theatre Communication Group National Conference. He also served as Dramaturg in residence at several of the Sundance Institute's Playwright's Conferences.

Files contain correspondence, development files, and conference materials, and Sundance Institute Playwrights Conference materials. In addition, a large portion of the collection contains annotated programs from performances Alper attended.

Sub-series III: Production Files, 1964-1995, (bulk dates 1974-1994) 43 boxes Arrangement: Alphabetical

Production files refer to all productions that were produced in any form in any of the Manhattan Theatre Club venues including: an informal In House Reading, a Cabaret performance, or an Upstage, Stage I or Stage II production. Files also refer to MTC productions that transferred to other Broadway and international theaters as well as touring dates. Materials include show related materials of correspondence, casting lists, show reports, stage manager reports, programs, and publicity. In addition, the collection contains a limited number of scripts and production photographs.

Proposed productions refer to shows that were actively considered for production. Some files contain only general correspondence or casting lists while others contain contracts and set designs.

In order to maintain Manhattan Theatre Club's designated divisions of Artistic and General Management departments, this sub-series can be found under both series Artistic Department and General Management series. While comparable documents can be found within these two series, the notes and departmental handling are unique.

Sub-series IV: Writers in Performance, 1971-1997 Arrangement: Alphabetical

Writers in Performance files contain materials related to the annual MTC literary series. Writers in Performance dates usually consisted of a single performance of readings and/or discussions of an author or multiple authors' works. In addition most seasons included a special benefit performance of a selected author's work. Some performances, especially benefit performances, utilized actors.

Materials include correspondence, scripts, programs, publicity, and photographs.

This sub-series contains the general management administrative files of the Manhattan Theatre Club. Items documenting audience development, correspondence files (kept as found within the collection), organizational history (e.g. Board of Directors' History of MTC papers), the Educational Outreach

Program, and everyday administration activities (internal documents—e.g. financial papers, reports and script submission lists) are contained within this subseries.

Sub-series II: Organization Files, 1966-1997 and undated Arrangement: Alphabetical 40 boxes

The Organization Files sub-series documents MTC staff activities with other businesses, primarily theater related associations, through its correspondence, reports, and financial papers. Of special interest are the files devoted to: the Alliance of Resident Theatres, Bohemian Benevolent and Literary Association of the City of NY (the court material), National Endowment for the Arts (the challenge grant reports), and Theatre Communications Group Inc.

Sub-series III: Production Files, 1966-2000 and undated 71 boxes Arrangement: Alphabetical

The Production Files sub-series primarily contain internal records that document the everyday administration concerns as they pertain to specific shows produced by the Manhattan Theatre Club. The types of documents within this series are: correspondence, stage manager / company rep reports, programs, clippings, publicity materials (advertising). Towards the end of this series, a section of proposed production materials is included (no proof MTC mounted the productions found in collection). Artistic files are included in this sub-series, due to close working relationship between Artistic department and General Management within the Manhattan Theatre Club.

In order to maintain Manhattan Theatre Club's designated divisions of Artistic and General Management departments, this sub-series can be found under both series Artistic Department and General Management series. While comparable documents can be found within these two series, the notes and departmental handling are unique.

The Spring Gala sub-series contains records pertaining to the organizations' yearly spring benefit at which staged performances of each season are showcased. Designed with entertaining in mind, the fund-raising event helps MTC fulfill its mission of producing new and contemporary plays on and off Broadway. As such, contracts, correspondence, production materials, financial records and various other materials generated by the annual gala are found in this sub-series.
