Creator History

Playwright, producer, director and screenwriter, Jack Kirkland was born on July 25, 1902 in St. Louis, Missouri and died on February 22, 1969 in New York City. His biggest success was the play *Tobacco Road*which he adapted from the novel by Erskine Caldwell. The original production ran for over 3000 performances on Broadway, 1933-1941. Kirkland went on to produce three more revivals of the show on Broadway and various productions toured the country for seventeen years. One production with an all-black cast was banned from Chicago and Detroit but played in London.

Kirkland began his career as a journalist. His first play, *Frankie and Johnnie*, opened in Chicago in 1928 and on Broadway in 1930. Other plays written by Kirkland include *Tortilla Flat*, adapted from the novel by John Steinbeck, *I Must Love Someone*, *Suds in Your Eye*, *Georgia Boy*, *Strange Boarders*, *Mr. Adam*, *Man with the Golden Arm*and *Mandingo*. He was the producer for a number of shows including

Bright Honor, Forbidden Melody, Suzanna and the Elders, Tanyard Streetand The Moon Vine. He also wrote or collaborated on screenplays including Now and Forever, The Golden Coach, with Jean Renoir, and Fifth Avenue Folly.

Jack Kirkland was married five times and had six children including the ballerina Gelsey Kirkland.

Scope and Content Note

The bulk of the collection is manuscripts by Kirkland including many drafts written in longhand. Includes scripts and story ideas for works that were ultimately produced and others that never were. The single box of personal and other papers includes everything else: a small amount of non-script material relating to productions, correspondence, legal papers and personal material including autobiographical writing.

Includes various drafts of produced plays such as *Frankie and Johnnie*, *Man with the Golden Arm*, *Mandingo*, *Suds in Your Eye*and *Tobacco Road*, but also story ideas and manuscripts that may never have been produced.

Series II. Personal and other papers 1932-1969 (1 box)

Contains an autobiographical manuscript (chapter 1), legal papers pertaining to Kirkland's suit against the city of Chicago for closing down *Tobacco Road*, a small amount of correspondence, various papers pertaining to productions such as telegrams, contracts, financial papers, programs and clippings, a Kirkland obituary, pilot log, and a transcript of his memorial service.

Chapter 1 of Kirkland's autobiography is mostly handwritten, also some typed pages, heavily revised.
