Isaac Disraeli, English writer. His volumes of biographical anecdotes, *Curiosities of Literature* (1791-1823), were highly popular throughout the 19th century. He is the father of Benjamin Disraeli, British prime minister and novelist.

person note ; begins, "Mr. Disraeli has had no opportunity..." -- 6 Oct 1845 : (MISC 0975) : 5 p. letter in the hand of an amanuensis who is referred to as his "filial secretary" (perhaps Benjamin Disraeli) ; signed by I. Disraeli.
