Abstract: Joseph Conrad (1857-1924) was a Polish author who wrote in English, and whose works are considered by many to be the immediate precursors to Modernist literature. Among his most famous works are Heart of Darkness and Lord Jim. The Joseph Conrad letters consist of two letters from Conrad, and one letter from Scottish writer Richard Curle discussing both his own work, and the serialization of Conrad's works
