Abstract: Samuel Austin Allibone was an American author and bibliographer, and from 1879 to 1888, a librarian of the Lenox Library, now the New York Public Library. His papers chiefly include correspondence, 1853-1899, including letters with George Putnam, Edward Everett, Robert Charles Winthrop, Ephraim Emerton, Horace Kephart, Charles W. Baird, R.C. Waterston, and others. Also included are a notebook, 1882, listing books on various subjects; and a library log marked "volume 2" kept by Allibone in the 1880s relating to books in the Lenox Library collection. Volume 1 is not present
