## Creator History

Maurice Kurtz is a writer, playwright and adapter of plays. In his early career he was an assistant to Erwin Piscator in the Studio Theater. He was instrumental in starting the theater program in UNESCO and was a former secretary-general of the International Theatre Institute (ITI). He has also written about theater for *Arts*, *Le Monde* and *The New York Times*.

## **Custodial History**

The collection was donated to the Billy Rose Theatre Division of the New York Public Library by Maurice Kurtz in July 2000.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The Maurice Kurtz papers span the years 1965-1999 and include correspondence from playwrights and members of the international theatrical community. There is considerable correspondence between Maurice Kurtz and Arthur Miller, and Kurtz and J. B. Priestley. Kurtz's interest in international theater and his involvement and relationship with UNESCO and ITI is apparent in most of the correspondence. Letters from Eugène Ionesco, René Maheu and Rolland Romain are in French. Other correspondents include Samuel Beckett, Al Hirschfeld, Arthur Miller and J. B. Priestley. The Arthur Miller correspondence is primarily about a French published version and later a French production of *Incident at Vichy*.
