Historical note

This collection consists chiefly of photographs donated to the International Gay Information Center Archives before its acquisition by The New York Public Library in 1988. Additional gifts of photography have been added to the collection during the 1990s. Scope and content note

The collection documents many aspects of the history and culture of gay men and lesbians, including activism, AIDS, erotica, pageants, parties and theatre. The collection includes snapshots, studio prints, movie stills, and slides. The materials date from 1886 to the present. While the majority of the materials are from the 1970's, there are several images from the 1950's.

The collection contains several photographs of historic interest. Such photographs include a group portrait of The Mattachine Society of Los Angeles founders at Christmas in 1951. Other historic photographs include a series of snapshots of the first Christopher Street Liberation Day march in 1970, and one 19th century image of a female impersonator.

A significant portion of the collection are the photographs of Bettye Lane, Fred W. McDarrah, and Richard C. Wandel. Each series includes a significant number of images of gay and lesbian activism and community life.

The Bettye Lane series includes four hundred and eighty images which depict life in the gay and lesbian community from 1970 to 1994. The series includes many photographs of community organizing activities; such photographs include lesbian consciousness raising groups, lesbian-feminist conferences, academic conferences, and NOW (National Organization for Women) events. Also included are portraits of lesbian activists and writers, and stills from a 1974 NBC television show called "Lesbian Lifestyles."

The Fred W. McDarrah series includes over one hundred photographs which depict many facets of the gay and lesbian community from the 1960's through the 1990's. The series includes photographs of marches and demonstrations, the AIDS Quilt, the Stonewall Inn around the time of the 1969 riots, and portraits.

The McDarrah photographs of marches and demonstrations are quite extensive. Demonstrations range from a photograph of the Mattachine Society's "sip -in" at Julius' bar in the 1960's, to Act Up demonstrations in the 1980's. Marches depicted range from the first gay pride march in New York City to the 1993 March on Washington.

The McDarrah series also includes several portraits of activists, politicians, writers and celebrities. Included are portraits of Tennessee Williams, Allen Ginsberg, Truman Capote, Joan Nestle, Jill Johnston, Jewelle Gomez and Mathilde Krim.

The Richard C. Wandel photographs consist of 8x10 and 4x5 positive prints (with a few contact prints) shot by Wandel in the period 1970-1972, 1981-83. They were taken at demonstrations, candlelight marches and "zaps" conducted by the Gay Activists Alliance in New York City and elsewhere. The photographs have been identified on the verso by Wandel. Included are numerous photographs of officers and members of GAA as well as other gay activists.

The Gay Male Erotica series is the largest group of photographs in the Ephemera collection. This series includes a large selection of male physique photographs from the 1950's and 1960's, which were donated by Paul J. Fasana. Several of these photographs are attributed to Bruce of Los Angeles and Lon of New York. However, the prints do not bear the name of the photographer due to censorship laws that were in effect at the time the prints were made. This series also includes several mail-order photographs from Target Studios, which are probably from the 1970's.
