## The Pforzheimer Collection

The Carl H. Pforzheimer Collection of Shelley and His Circle is one of the world's leading repositories for the study of British Romanticism. Comprising over 20,000 items, the collection is conceptually centered on the life and works of the poet Percy Bysshe Shelley and his friends, relatives, and contemporaries. Formerly a part of the much larger and now dispersed Pforzheimer Library, the Pforzheimer Collection came to The New York Public Library in 1986.

## Related materials

In addition to manuscripts in William Michael Rossetti's hand, the Pforzheimer Collection also holds copies of his editions of Shelley's *Poetical Works* and *Adonais*, and copies of the original and reprint editions of *The Germ*.

Additional W. M. Rossetti manuscript material at the New York Public Library can be found in the Henry W. and Albert A. Berg Collection of English and American Literature and in the Manuscripts and Archives Division.

## Arrangement

This guide considers the William Michael Rossetti manuscript material in the following series: Series I, Writings; and Series II, Correspondence. The writings in Series I are listed in chronological order. The correspondence in Series II are listed in alphabetical order, by recipient.

## Scope and content

The William Michael Rossetti manuscript material in the Pforzheimer Collection consists of writings and correspondence. The writings include: holograph drafts and notes for his 1870 edition of Shelley's poetical works, and drafts and proof emendations for the 1901 reprint of the Pre-Raphaelite journal, *The Germ*. The bulk of the correspondence is dated between 1883 and 1911. Correspondents include: H. B. Forman, bibliographer and forger; Elliot Stock, publisher of the reprint of *The Germ*; Edward John Trelawny, writer and adventurer; T. J. Wise, book collector and forger; and over a dozen others.
