- To Sir Robert Harry Inglis, politician: 1 autograph letter signed: "Monday": (MISC 3972): [no place]: begins, "I will wait on you on the 4th Health & Heather serving." Tipped into the grangerized copy of Hazlitt's Spirit of the Age. Shelved under Hazlitt with bound manuscripts.
- To Sir John Malcolm, diplomatist and administrator in India: 1 autograph letter signed: 4 Jun 1808: (MISC 0447): from Bombay: begins, "The public dispatches from the Prince of Wales would apprise you of all that can be publicly known respecting 'His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary' &c. &c. &c. ...".
- · To J. Milles, Esq. at Lincoln's Inn: 1 autograph letter signed: 2 Jan 1799: (MISC 0451): from Hoke House near Cobham: begins, "I deferred answering your very kind letter till I could report progress with respect to my exertions ...".
- · To M. [Mondlet?] in Paris : 1 autograph letter signed : 10 Dec 1802 : (MISC 0439) : from 60 Upper Guilford Street, London : in French; begins, "Le depart de mon ami M. Greathead ne me laisse q'un moment pour vous dire ...".
- · To Amelia Opie, novelist and poet: 1 autograph letter signed: 30 Sep 1805: (O'ANA 0004): from Bombay: begins, "Many thanks for all your late presents, your good cousin, your most affecting novel & your elegant verses." Also including, "I agree with you about the commencement of the third volume of Godwin's novel. It is most masterly. There are other admirable parts; but, taken throughout, I think it the worst of his three; though far indeed above the limits of a vulgar fate." Mounted in the grangerized copy of Brightwell's life of Opie. Shelved with oversized manuscript volumes.
- To Samuel Rogers, poet: 1 autograph letter signed: 11 Dec 1815: (MISC 0452): from Weedon Lodge near Aylesbury: begins, "I shall have real pleasure in waiting on Lord & Lady Spencer of whose acquaintance I have long been ambitious.".

- To Martin Archer Shee, portrait painter and writer: 1 autograph address panel signed: [no date]: (SHEE 0102): [no place]: addressed to Shee at Cavendish Square; marked "Private." Mounted in the Martin Archer Shee Autograph Album. Shelved with bound manuscript volumes under "Shee.".
- To M. Thiers: 1 autograph letter signed: 27 Aug 1825: (MISC 0449): from Harrogate: in French; begins, "[? aux?] deja recu [sans?] Monsr. l'Etat de nos Finances de que vous avez desiré par les mains de M. Murray.".
