- · Holograph poem, "England, written in October 1815": [Oct 1815]: (MISC 1373.19): 5 pages (2 double sheets): [no place]: begins, "Dear native land! whom the free sky rewards / with showers of bounty, -- calm & freshness pouring ..."; addressed to Taylor and Hessey on the final leaf of the second double sheet.

- double sheets): [no place]: introduction begins, "The child, whose unexpected fate has given rise to the following poem, lately died at Paris ..."; poem begins, "Our little Boy is dead!".

- · To John Taylor (1781-1864), publisher and writer: 2 letters: -- 1 autograph letter signed: "Tuesday": (MISC 1373.02): 2 \(^1\)_ pages (double sheet): from 14 Park Place, Baker St.: begins, "I have got a little legal business to transact; -- to manage which I have need of a respectable Solicitor ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed: "Saturday": (MISC 1373.03): 1 page (double sheet): from 42 Clarendon Sq.r: begins, "Bargaining apart, I shall be glad to see you tomorrow ...".
- · To Taylor and Hessey, publishers: 8 letters: -- 1 autograph letter signed: 2 Jan 1817: (MISC 1373.05): 1 ¹/ pages (double sheet): from Hotel Mayence, Rue St. Honoré, 352, Paris: begins, "I am safely arrived at Paris & has the satisfaction to find Mrs. Scott pretty well ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed : "Monday" [Jan 1817] : (MISC 1373.06) : 2 pages (double sheet) : [no place] : begins, "I postpone sending the conclusion of the Poem till next week ..." -- 1 autograph letter (fragment): [Jan 1817]: (MISC 1373.07): 1 page (partial sheet): [no place]: begins, "There is a serious mistake in the 12th line from the end of the last Proof sentence." -- 1 autograph letter signed: 23 Jan 1817: (MISC 1373.08): 3 pages (double sheet): from Hotel Mayence, Rue St. Honoré, 352: begins, "The name is a work of some difficulty ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed: 4 Feb 1817: (MISC 1373.09): 6 pages (1 double sheet; 1 single sheet): from Paris: begins, "I have, since my return to Paris, as I find there is no travelling for some time yet, turned my mind very seriously to a work of the nature we have already spoken of ..."; with a four page (double sheet) list of books in Scott's hand. -- 1 autograph letter signed: 6 Feb 1817: (MISC 1373.10): 3 ¹/ pages (double sheet): from Paris: begins, "I do not think it will be at all necessary for me to see the proofs of the copy now sent ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed: 24 Feb 1817: (MISC 1373.11): 4 pages (double sheet): from Paris: begins, "I am extremely vexed by a letter I have just received from Mrs. Scott ..." -- 1 autograph letter signed: 28 Feb 1817: (MISC 1373.14): 2 pages (single sheet): from Paris: begin, "I was very glad to find by the packet which I received to day, that my doubts expressed in my last, as to my proper understanding of Mrs. Scott's letter, are well-founded ...";
