Scope and Content Note

- Autograph receipt signed : [document effective 1698-1699] : (MISC 0524) : in French; begins, "Pour servir de quittance a Monsieur le pilleur Conseiller du Roy Tresorier General de sa maison de la somme de six mil livres ...".
- To "le reverent Pere Dom Julien Bellaise" at the Abbaye de St. Ouen in Rouen : 1 autograph letter signed : 29 Oct 1706 : (MISC 0522) : in French; relating to the copy of a document in the abbey of Fontenay, and to other matters concerning the abbey; begins, "Le sejour que je fais a Paris ne me permettant pas, mon reverend Pere, de vous donner la copie que vous me demandez ...".
- To Christof Sand, writer and scholar : 1 autograph letter unsigned : 16 Apr 1679 : (MISC 0521) : in Latin; from Paris; on a passage from the Song of Songs; also on the Vulgate, Sand's library, and his own work editing the works of Origen; along with an early 20th century English translation of the letter,

in an unknown hand.

- . To an unidentified "Monsieur" : 1 autograph letter signed : 19 Oct 1656 : (MISC 0519) : from Caen; in French; begins, "Votre lettre m'a donné la plus grande joie du monde ...".
- . To an unidentified recipient : 1 autograph letter unsigned : 8 Jul 1660 : (MISC 0520) : from Caen; in French; begins, "Je ne vous ay pas dit q[ue] ie condonne l'O, ou le Vocabatif au commencement d'un Pœme ...".
- . To an unidentified "Monsieur" : 1 autograph letter signed : 1 Aug 1687 : (MISC 0523) : from Aunay; in French; admonishing his correspondent for not having wanted to enter the Academy; justifying a comparison between Moses and Priapus.
- . To an unidentified "Monsieur" : 1 autograph letter signed : [no date] : (MISC 0525) : in French; begins, "Vous me fîtes l'honneur dernierement de m'assurer de la protection du Roi ...".
