Scope and Content Note

- · Holograph biography, History of the Life and Voyages of Christopher Columbus: [circa 1828]: (MISC 0813): fifty-two holograph pages within five folio volumes; the rest of the manuscript in divers hands of various copyists. Shelved with oversized manuscript volumes.
- · Holograph biography (fragment), Chapter XXII from his Life of George Washington: [circa 1855?]: (MISC 0677): in ink; on sheets of varying sizes, mounted to 21 leaves within a brown half pebble-grain calf binding, spine gilt, with marbled boards. Narrative text begins, "While affairs were approaching a crisis in Virginia, troubles were threatening from the north." Shelved under "Irving" with bound manuscript materials.
- · Holograph page from his Life of George Washington: [circa 1855?]: (MISC 3983): one page,

- numbered "231," with some cancellations and emendations; begins, "Ravaging incursions from Canada had harassed the northern parts of the State of New York of late " Tipped into the grangerized copy of Hazlitt's Spirit of the Age. Shelved with bound manuscripts under "Hazlitt.".
- · Holograph page from his History of the Life and Voyages of Christopher Columbus: [before 1828]: (MISC 3536): one page, numbered "335," with some cancellations; begins, "... the country, while the Spaniards who remained loyal, fearing conspiracies among the natives".
- · Holograph announcement signed: [on of after 13 November 1851]: (MISC 0651): one page; in his capacity as president of "Friends of the Late J. Fenimore Cooper," a committee formed to create a monument to Cooper in New York; announcing that Henry Grinnell will act as Treasurer; endorsed by committee Secretary Rufus W. Griswold.
- · Autograph notes on the Tower of London: [no date]: (MISC 4490): 1 page (double sheet): [no place]: begins, "... to [also?] Quanto plus afflictionis pro Christo in hoc saeculo, tanto plus gloriae cum Christo in futuro...." Briefly discusses carved memorial of Lady Jane Grey.
- To Messrs. Lea & Blanchard, Philadelphia booksellers: 1 autograph letter signed: 21 July 1841: (MISC 0008): from New York; begins, "I have to acknowledge the receipt of the leter of your Mr. Lea of July 17th relative to a second edition of Miss Davidson's Memoirs, &c. ".
- To Henry Brevoort, his friend: 1 autograph letter signed: 8 June 1811: (MISC 0653): from New York; begins, "L'Herbette has just informed me of an opportunity which departs today, of writing to you.".
- To Anne Murray, wife of the publisher John Murray: 1 autograph letter signed: [29 November 1829?]: from Chandos Street; begins, "I have delayed replying to your obliging invitation to dinner....".
- · To John Murray, publisher: 2 letters: -- 1 autograph letter signed: 22 December 1823: (MISC 1332): from Rue Richelieu, Paris; begins, "I wrote to you some short time now on the subject of the Arabian tales..."; mentioning his hopes to furnish "a brace more of volumes of the Sketch Book in the course of the spring...."--1 autograph letter signed: 1 May 1841: (MISC 1356): from New York; begins, "Permit me to make you acquainted with Mr. Thomas W. Stearns, who has recently married a favorite niece of mine....".
- To Mary Shelley, novelist: 1 autograph letter third person: 28 May 1830: (S'ANA 0251): from 8 Argyll Street; saying that he "will have great pleasure in waiting on her on Monday evening....".
- · To Moses Thomas, Philadelphia bookseller: 1 autograph letter signed: 3 May 1816: (B'ANA 0230): from Liverpool; begins, "Inclosed you have a bill of lading of a Box and a paper parcel of periodical works forwarded by the ship Margaret..."; also saying that he is sending "three different editions of Lord Byron's last poems," and mentioning Hebrew Melodies and The Curse of Minerva.
- To an unidentified niece or nephew: 1 autograph closing and signature: [no date]: (MISC 4023.15d): a tiny fragment from an autograph letter; reads, "Your affectionate uncle, Washington Irving." Mounted in the Mary Ann Humble Autograph Album. Shelved with oversized manuscript volumes.
- · To "My dear Sir": 1 autograph letter signed: 2 Dec 1829: (MISC 0328): from Chandos Street; begins, "I regret that I must again decline an invitation to dine with you..."; also, "I cannot but express how much I was delighted last night by the acting and appearance of Miss E[llen] Tree....".
