- · From Vincenza Zatta and Domenica Favro, proprietors of the cafés called the Costanza and the Speranza: 1 letter signed: 11 Apr 1818: (B'ANA 0284): in Italian; knowing Byron to be a patron of their cafés, requesting that he intervene in legal proceedings on their behalf.
