With notes for the opening of the preface on the verso of the first leaf; all other versos blank.
- · Holograph essay, "Sir Henry Taylor on Shelley": [watermark = 1879]: (S'ANA 0123): 2 pages (2 single sheets): [no place]: published in his Miscellanies (1886); begins, "Ten days after the appearance of this essay I received from the illustious & venerable author of Philip van Artevelde a letter containing a word of protest ...".

- · Holograph essay (fragment), "Notes on the Text of Shelley": [between May 1869 and 1875]: (S'ANA 731): 1 page (single sheet): [no place]: the note at the foot of page 190 of his Essays and Studies (1875); the essay was first published (without this note) in the Fortnightly Review, May 1869; begins, "When this passage was written I was of course not ignorant that in an extant manuscript of this poem Shelley had himself filled up the gap with the word 'king' ...".

(embossed stationery): in French; begins, "Je vous remercie, et je vous felicite, de tout mon cœur." -- -- 1 autograph letter signed to "Dear Sir": 1 Oct 1893: (MISC 1882): 1 page (double sheet): from The Pines, Putney Hill, S.W. (printed stationery): begins, "Many thanks for the copies of the new number of the 'Nineteenth Century' ...".
