A Tragi-Comedy, in Five Acts": 7-14 Dec 1821: (S'ANA 0578): 1 volume (103 manuscript pages, 60 total leaves): play text begins, "Act I. Scene I. Italy. A Wood near Pavia. Enter Saladin, and Achmet. Sal. I do mistrust our spies:-- for, through the towns, / The Busy, populous towns that yet we've passed . . . . " Notebook with vellum-backed binding. Shelved as \*Pforz 559R 14.
- · Journal (extracts; transcript): 22 Oct 1821-30 Jun 1822 [transcription date between May 1897 and 1902]: (S'ANA 0694): 22 ¹/\_ page fascicle (5 double sheets, 2 single sheets): manuscript copy in the hand of Richard Garnett; copied from the original, now in the British Library. Some portions of entries do not appear in Garnett's 1902 edition of the journal.
- To Thomas Medwin, writer and biographer: 1 autograph letter signed: [3 Jun 1821]: (S'ANA 0397): 2 <sup>1</sup>/\_ pages (double sheet): from Villa Poschi, Pugnano, 7 miles from Pisa: begins, "I am more annoyed than I can describe to you at the receipt of your last letter....".
- To Jane Williams, his wife: 1 autograph letter signed: [6 Jul 1822]: (S'ANA 0152): 3 pages (double sheet): from Leghorn: begins, "I have just left the quay, my dearest girl, and the wind blows right across to Spezia....".
