Description The Ford Autograph Collection was compiled between 1840 and 1898 by Gordon Lester Ford and his sons, Worthington Chauncy Ford and Paul Leicester Ford. The collection was purchased in 1898 by J. Pierpont Morgan, who kept a portion of the material for his ewa collection and denated the remainder to the New York Public Library that same year. Gerden L. Ford, bern in Connecticut in 1823, was the longtime business manager of the New York Tribune and had substantial banking and railroad interests. He died in New York City in 1891. His oldest som, Werthington, was berm in Brooklyn in 1858 and died in 1941. He was educated at Columbia University and was the chief of the Bureau of Statistics of the State and Treasury Departments in Washington from 1885-1898, the chief of the Manuscript Division of the Library of Congress from 1903 to 1909, and an editor of the Massachusetts Historical Society from 1909 te 1929. He them retired to France, where he lived throughout the remaining years of his life. Worthington's younger brether, Paul, was been in Brooklym in 1865 and lived in New York until his death in 1902. He was a journalist, novelist, bibliographer, biographer, and historical editer.

The collection contains the autograph letters of American Presidents, heads of governmental agencies, cengressmen, gevernors, generals, and a great many artists, as well as these of distinguished European politicians, dating from 1589 to 1898. A substantial portion of the 18th century material, including autographs by the signers of the Declaration of Independence and other figures of the American Revolution have been transferred to the Division's Miscellaneous Papers. The Ford Autograph Collection also includes correspondence of the Ford family.
