Ethel Huyler Gray was an actress, author and editor. She was born June 14, 1877 in New York City to Fannie Marnina Huyler and Wharton Johnson Gray. Gray worked in the theatre for 12 years, including 3 years with Sothern-Marlowe Company and 2 years with E.H. Sothern. Afterwards, Gray handled reports of State Legislatures for the Corporate Trust Company while also compilging digests of law pamphlets. Gray was head advertising (proof) reader for Conde Naste Press in Greenwich, Connecticut for 6 years. As author, editor and researcher, Gray worked for the New York Theosophical Society. It appears that she didinot marry or have any children. Ethel H. Gray death date is not known.  Of  The papers consist of mainly incoming correspondence, 1908-58. Prominent correspondants are F.H. LaGuardia and Walter Owne (British author). Subjects covered include personal matters including her interest in the environment and her claims as a patentee to New Harlem. Writings are literary manuscripts, speeches and complications on St. Mark's Church (NYC), the unicorn and Roman Britain.  Photographs are of family members.
