Description Harold G. Henderson was born in New York City in 1880 and died there in 1974. Considered by many scholars to be the father of American Haiku, he was an Haiku poet, author, translator, and anthologist of Japanese poetry, as well as a chemical engineer. After taking degrees at Columbia University in 1910 and 1915, he began to study Japanese language and culture. From 1930 to 1934 he resided in Japan, and in 1936 he began teaching the history of Japanese art at Columbia. He was elected vice president of the Japan Society, and served as president from 1948 to 1952, and also served as president of the Society of Japanese Studies. In 1945 he served in Japan on General MacArthur's staff and became head of the Education, Religion, and Art and Monuments sections of the Civil Information and Education staff. For his services to Japan as an interpreter and proponent of its culture, the Order of the Sacred Treasure was conferred on him in 1960 by Emperor Hirohito. Among his published books and articles are, "The Bamboo Broom," "The Handbook of Japanese Grammar," and, "An Introduction to Haiku".

The collection includes correspondence, 1960-1974, with poets, scholars, translators, and editors related to Haiku, some letters and papers, 1948 and 1960, concerning Post Wheeler's translation of the Ho-Dan-Zo, and general correspondence of the 1930's. There are also drafts of An Introduction to Haiku, notes on Haiku, typescript and author's file copy of Tales from the Japanese Storytellers, selected and edited by Henderson, lecture notes for a course in Japanese grammar, manuscript of "How to Determine Dates of Japanese Color Prints..." by K.C. Kondo, and some papers relating to the Haiku Society of America.
