Abstract: Fran Lee (née Frances Lederman, 1910-2010) was an actress, model, consumer advocate, and television personality who appeared on early television programs as "Mrs. Fix-It." The collection dates from 1925 to 1994 and contains correspondence, professional files, video tapes, and films.

Creator History

Fran Lee was an actress and consumer activist who for many years was known as "Mrs. Fix-it."

Fran Lee (née Frances Lederman) was born in New York City in 1910. In 1929, she married Samuel Weiss and became an actress, often using the stage name Karen Stewart. In the 1940s, Lee took the name by which she is now known and appeared on television as "Mrs. Fix-it," providing household advice and handicraft ideas. She became a consumer advocate on both television and radio. In 1948 and 1949, she and her son Gene toured with the *Medea* touring company across the United States.

Fran Lee continued to make appearances on television for nearly fifty years. She had her own program entitled Mrs. Fix-it, and appeared on other programs as the "Tidy Dee Lady," "Mrs. Consumer," and "Granny Franny." Each of these personae offered advice on how to improve conditions in the home. She appeared regularly on The Frances Langford - Don Ameche Show, The Skitch Henderson Show, and The New Yorker Show. She made guest appearances on The Ernie Kovacs Show, The Steve Allen Show, The Tonight Show, and The Mike Douglas Show. Fran Lee was also seen in a series of commercials for various products in the 1950s and 1960s. In the 1970s, she appeared on a variety of New York City television channels, including WNEW, Channel Five, and WPIX Channel Eleven News, as their consumer editor.

Fran Lee continued to be a vocal spokesperson on consumer issues into the 1990s. She was one of several people responsible for the enactment of New York City's "pooper scooper" law, dealing with the disposal of dog waste on the city streets. She was the founder of Menonomous, a support group for women in menopause.

Fran Lee died in 2010.

Scope and Content Note

The Fran Lee papers date from 1925 to 1994 and document her career as an actress and consumer advocate. The collection contains correspondence, professional files, and video tapes and films of her appearances on television.

The films and video tapes make up the bulk of the collection. They document Fran Lee's career from the 1940s to the 1970s and include her appearances on early television programs, such as The Skitch Henderson Show, Who Do You Trust? (with Johnny Carson), The Steve Allen Show, and The Frances Langford - Don Ameche Show. There are also recordings of commercials in which she appeared, regular consumer news segments she hosted for WPIX and WNEW in New York City, and segments from The Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee.

Professional files contain photographs, articles, contracts, press releases, and printed material pertaining to Fran Lee's career as a consumer advocate, model, and actress.

Series I: Correspondence 1944-1994 (4 boxes, 2 folders)

This series consists of correspondence received and sent by Fran Lee. Included are letters from Fran Lee's time with the touring company of *Medea*, as well as letters from viewers of her program, *Mrs. Fix-It*. Professional correspondence documents her acting, modeling, and consumer advocacy.

b. 1 Fran Lee letters concerning Medea 1948-1949

Consists of letters written by Fran Lee as she toured with the cast of *Medea*. Most are written to her husband. Sam Weiss.

b. 2 Gene Weiss letters concerning Medea 1948-1949

This is a group of letters written by Lee's oldest son, Gene Weiss (stage name Gene Lee), to his father. The letters discuss his experiences touring with *Medea*.

b. 3-4 "Mrs. Fix-It" Correspondence 1950-1958

Consists of Fran Lee's correspondence with viewers of *Mrs. Fix-It.* Incoming letters usually requested information on issues discussed on the show. Outgoing letters responded to those requests and included notices of Fran Lee's upcoming television appearances.

b. 5 f. 1-2 Professional Correspondence 1944-1994

b. 5-16 Series II: Moving Images 1949-1976

This series consists of Fran Lee's television appearances in her role as a consumer advocate. They document her career and also highlight some of the celebrities she worked with.

The films and video tapes were all transferred to VHS viewer access copies.

2.1 Regular Appearances 1949-1969 (53 items)

Consists of Fran Lee's regular appearances on various television shows. She was known as "Mrs. Fix-it" on many of these and would offer household and handicraft tips. Fran Lee appeared frequently on *The Don Ameche-Frances Langford Show, The New Yorker Show, The Skitch Henderson Show* and *The Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee*. Fran Lee's appearances on each of these shows are listed below, in chronological order:.

The Skitch Henderson Show 1968-09-20 to 1969-04-01; undated

The Skitch Henderson Show

This segment, Listen Fran, features Fran Lee giving advice to a father who has trouble with a child who is breast fed and only wants his mother.

00261 (Time: 7:10 (B&W))

Skitch Henderson introduces Fran Lee's segment by telling about all the things she's done. She talks about housing and the problems one faces in finding a proper home, in particular apartments. She offers advice for apartment hunting.

00263 (Time: 7:34 (B&W))

Fran Lee deals with carpet dealers in her weekly segment on The Skitch Henderson Show.

The Skitch Henderson Show

00270 (Time: 8:15 (B&W))

Fran Lee reads viewer complaints about her expose on the frozen foods of the city. She then goes on to a report on the Bowery section of Manhattan, in particular, a park in the Bowery and how no one can use it. She talks about her love for the city and reminisces about the past and bemoans the fact that many cannot enjoy the pleasure of parks because they are not well-maintained.

Fran Lee talks, in her weekly segment, about the dangers of using cyclamates as a sugar substitute. Cyclamates were being used in diet soda at that time.

Fran Lee talks about the dangers of poisons and the caution parents should take when leaving medication about in front of children.

Fran Lee gives advice in response to viewers questions. For example, she advises a woman who is match her son up with a woman she has met.

Skitch Henderson introduces Fran Lee who relates her trip to Morocco and the purchases she made. She tells about the hospitality of the Moroccans and French.

The Skitch Henderson Show 09/20/1968

Fran Lee shows the problems with many of the panty hose products that are available. She urges women who buy faulty panty hose to take them back to the store and complain to the manufacturer.

The Skitch Henderson Show 09/27/1968

00268 (Time: 6:52 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about fiber glass draperies and how they can cause irritation to those who own them. There is an apparent danger of actual glass slivers from the drapery catching people. The government stepped in and required manufacturers to put a notice about the possible danger of fiber glass draperies.

The Skitch Henderson Show 10/18/1968

00330 (Time: 5:20 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about freezer units in supermarkets. The temperature is not kept properly in the frozen food section.

The Skitch Henderson Show 10/28/1968

00340 (Time: 6:55 (B&W))

Fran Lee praises the virtues of wool and offers advice on to care for it in her weekly segment.

The Skitch Henderson Show 11/15/1968

00333 (Time: 8:00 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about the dangers of many of the toys that parents will buy for their children in the upcoming Christmas season. She urges parents to watch out for the toys they buy.

The Skitch Henderson Show 11/22/1968

00351 (Time: 6:32 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about the virtues of the egg, from the taste to the nutritional value. She shows how to prepare the egg.

Skitch Henderson's New York 11/26/1968

00208 (Time: 2:20 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about the trip to Morocco she is going to take and the shopping she will do there. She will not appear on the show for two weeks after this.

The Skitch Henderson Show 12/27/1968

00337 (Time: 8:10 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears in a bathtub, praising the virtues of bathing. She gives a history of bathtubs and talks about the best types.

The Skitch Henderson Show 01/14/1969

00352 (Time: 7:25 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears with her grandson, Jonathan Weiss, caring for him because her daughterin-law had just had a baby girl. Fran Lee shows how to repair old chairs.

The Skitch Henderson Show 01/31/1969

00329 (Time: 8:25 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about prescription drugs in her weekly segment of the show. She tells the audience of the letters she receives telling her she should become the new consumer affairs commissioner. She also attacks the hippies.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/04/1969

00203 (Time: 5:00 (B&W))

Fran Lee offers humorous advice in a segment called "Listen Fran". In this segment, she shows how to care for marble pieces.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/07/1969

00256 (Time: 8:45 (B&W))

Fran Lee's weekly segment is introduced by Skitch Henderson and commented on by comedian Rip Taylor. Fran Lee tidies up some old business by talking about panty hose refunds and the recall of a Mennen product. She then goes on to discuss chopped meat and the government's protection of fresh meat. Rip Taylor appears at the end of the segment and marches off stage with Fran Lee.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/08/1969

00367 (Time: 7:06 (B&W))

Fran Lee offers some corrections concerning information in earlier reports and then lectures on the cleaning enzymes used in many cleaning products.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/11/1969

00365 (Time: 7:50 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows the art treasures she picked up on her trip to Morocco. She urges people to behave when they are abroad and not add to the image of the "ugly American". This drew some groans from the audience.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/18/1969

00211 (Time: 4:10 (B&W))

Fran Lee is featured in a segment, "Listen Fran", of the Skitch Henderson Show answering people's mail. She urges viewers to enter a contest asking for suggestions to make the city smell a little sweeter. She insults Mayor Lindsey and complains about the men who do not care about the problems around them.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/21/1969

00336 (Time: 7:25 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about the troubles people face when they leave clothing to be cleaned at the cleaners. She offers suggestions as to how to make it easier for clothes to be returned in one piece.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/25/1969

00338 (Time: 7:45 (B&W))

The winners of Fran Lee's "If I Were Mayor" contest are announced and Fran Lee reads the winners suggestions on the air. All entries were sent on to then Mayor Lindsey of New York.

The Skitch Henderson Show 02/26/1969

00355 (Time: 11:09 (B&W))

Skitch Henderson reads a poetic letter from a viewer who praises Fran Lee's consumer activism. Doctor Robert Feldman, a gynecologist, is Fran Lee's guest, and talks about estrogen treatments and menopause. Dr. Feldman talks about the troubles with doctor-patient relationships and relates it to the media's view and portrayal. The doctor defends his profession by showing examples of the difficulties faced by doctors today. Fran Lee argues that many doctors are unwilling to help women with estrogen treatments for menopause, which the doctor refutes. The doctor tells of the fears of doctors of giving estrogen

The Skitch Henderson Show 03/17/1969

00267 (Time: 8:19 (B&W))

Fran Lee welcomes Bess Myerson as the new Consumer Affairs Commissioner for New York City. She urges Bess Myerson to worry about her job and not her looks. She then talks about fruit juices and how very few of them contain actual fruit. She lists the ingredients of these concentrate drinks.

The Skitch Henderson Show 03/18/1969

00228 (Time: 6:10 (B&W))

On this episode Fran Lee calls herself "Second Hand Fran". The segment opens with her singing. She shows how one can find cheap items at second hand sales, including used silverware. She also shows off an inexpensive dress she purchased. Arnold Stang also makes an appearance and they dance together. Charlie Callis, the comedian, is also featured, wearing a swimsuit circa 1920. He dances around with Fran Lee and Arnold Stang.

The Skitch Henderson Show 03/21/1969

00201

Skitch Henderson is joined by Tony Martin, Gene Baliss and Arnold Stang. Fran Lee appeared weekly on Skitch's show with a consumer report for the viewers. Her segment on the show opens with her singing "Young at Heart". She shows off her "Fix-it" for the day, her outfit. She then talks about cosmetics. She advises that a facelift is better than using miracle cosmetics or lots of makeup. She comments on the double standards of dating an older person. Tony Martin then proceeds to come up to her and plants a passionate kiss on her lips. The Skitch Henderson Show aired on WNEW (later WNYW Channel Five) at two in the afternoon in the late 1960s. Time: 6:20 (B).

The Skitch Henderson Show 03/25/1969

00354 (Time: 8:05 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about the types of teas by playing the part of the older, kosher wife of a Chinese Nobleman. His younger wife, "who knew how to dip his tea just right" is played by Anne Meara. Fran Lee gives a history of tea as they hold a tea ceremony. She shows a small tea strainer used in making individual cups of tea.

The Skitch Henderson Show WNEW 04/01/1969

00243 (Time: 2:40 (B&W))

Fran Lee appeared in this segment as a heckler in the audience. She attacks the panel members who are into the swinging sexual lifestyle.

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee 1969-10-14 to 1969-12-05

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee, WNEW 1969 (Time: 58:35 (color))

These segments ran at the end of the afternoon movie on then WNEW, later WNYW Channel 5. Fran Lee offered suggestions and remedies for reusing old clothing and other items around the house. She asked viewers to write in with their own suggestions called, "My Fix-Its". She also told viewers to give themselves a rose each day; urged parents to vaccinate their children against German measles, which was reaching epidemic proportions in 1969; and stressed the importance cleaning bathrooms properly. In the next segment, demonstrated how to design a turkey out of a melon. This is followed by Fran Lee showing how to make lamp shade covers out of old stockings. She next talks about glassware. (Note: The video on this segment is skewed, but straightens out towards the end of the piece.) (Note: The next five segments are duplicates of 00254, which contains the complete segment and is a much better quality video.) This is followed by an appearance by Fran Lee's grandson, Jonathan Weiss. She then shows how to make mittens out of old sweaters. She then does a commercial for Mario's Greene County Ravioli. Fran Lee then shows how to make designs out of food cakes. Next she talks about the joys of eggs. Finally, she talks about the growing problem of dog waste on the street.

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee, WNEW 1969

00099 (Time: 57:20 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows how she makes various items out of old sweaters. Next, she shows how to make a bacon and creme cheese bagel. She shows an old woman doll she picked up in Russia as well as some other items. She relates some of her experiences there. She lambastes the quality of panty hose. (Note: The panty hose segment is a duplicate of 00100 which is in color.) Next, she shows how one can wear fancy clothes that can be found in thrift stores. The preparation of steaks follows. Her "rose for the day", a helpful tip to the ladies, is to wash one's hands and hair with lemon juice. Finally, she shows some of the pictures she took when she visited Russia. (Note: The video quality of this tape is poor. Not all the segments are complete.).

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee, WNEW 1969

00253 (Time: 25:30 (color))

This recording features a series of segments broadcast during the Ladies Day Movie. These include an appearance by Jonathan Weiss, who displays toys that children can make themselves and demonstrates how they can help their parents around the house. In the next segment, Fran Lee shows how to make mittens out of old sweaters. This is followed by a commercial for Mario's Green County Ravioli and a feature on making cute designs out of cakes for children's parties. Finally, there are segments on immunizing children for an epidemic of German Measles, and an interview with poultry and egg commissioner, Howard Helmer, on the uses of eggs.

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee, WNEW 1969

00254 (Time: 1:07:20 (color))

This features a series of segments including an appearance by Fran Lee's husband, Sam Weiss, celebrating their 40th anniversary. This is followed by a segment with Fran Lee's grandson, Jonathan Weiss. In the next segment, Fran Lee attacks the rats that infest the city, advertisers that do not proclaim the truth, the improper cleaning of one's home and the care of fur and wool products. The final piece is on hats and their care.

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee late 1960s

00100 (Time: 53:36 (color))

Segments featuring Fran Lee in this afternoon program include: a look at "Stockings", a trip on the "Moscow Subway", the care of "Pearls", the dangers of "Indoor Heaters" and making "Fur Hats Afghan Dresses". Each segment ran about ten minutes.

Ladies Day Movie 10/14/1969

00348 (Time: 22:18 (B&W))

This special segment features a live audience. The topic was menopause and Fran Lee's guests are Dr. Richard Craven and Margaret Hutz. Fran Lee relates the troubles she had as a woman with menopause. The guests then take questions from the audience. WNEW.

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee 11/03/1969

00237 (Time: 3:15 (B&W))

Cyclamate additives are the topic of Fran Lee's consumer break during the midday movie on WNEW Channel Five. Fran Lee also picks winners of a contest for fix-it suggestions that were sent in.

Ladies Day Movie, Menopause 11/07/1968

00364 (Time: 4:57 (B&W))

Fran Lee introduces the Ladies Day Movie starring Isadora Duncan, a woman she admires. Fran Lee also talks about menopause.

Ladies Day Movie 11/11/1969

00271 (Time: 15:40 (B&W))

Fran Lee introduces Sam Baker, author of The Permissible Lie. Before going into the interview with him, she extols the virtues of Whirlpool for improving their customer relations. Mister Baker is a former advertiser who wrote the book about how advertising is often fraudulent. Baker offers examples of how advertisers try to commit fraud.

Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee 11/18/1969

00213 (Time: 10:22 (B&W))

This segment features Fran Lee talking about the sanitation situation in New York City, in particular the droppings left by walked dogs. She talks about the diseases one can get by being near or touching the dropping. She shows a pooper scooper. She also complains that dogs are often treated better than children. She updates the audience about her Fix-it contest, where one sends in ideas that can make life easier.

Ladies Day Movie 11/25/1969

00341 (Time: 10:00 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about the wonders of chicken soup and shows how to make it.

Ladies Day Movie 11/27/1969

00273 (Time: 13:04 (B&W))

Fran Lee pitches Belgian Endives and Mario's Greene County Ravioli in separate commercials that ran during the midday movie. On her segment in the movie, she announces that it's her 40th anniversary with Sam Weiss, her husband. They talk about how they met and how they managed to stay together all the years. They show pictures of their younger days and their family. A chef comes on and cooks them a meal. The couple then dance. WNEW.

Ladies Day Movie 12/05/1969

00342 (Time: 13:10 (B&W))

This was Fran Lee's last feature on the Ladies Day Movie. She was promoted to consumer editor for WNEW channel five news. In her last segment, she talks about the selection and care of leather goods.

Our Fran 1968 to 1969

Our Fran, WNEW 1968 00097 (Time: 1:00:15 (B&W))

Fran Lee hosted this weekday afternoon program on then WNEW Channel Five in New York. In it she offered advise and household tips. Here, Fran Lee talks with Will Richardson, a tie-die designer. He shows how one can do tie dyeing at home. A report on sodium cyclamates follows. She was active in the removal of the additive from foodstuffs on the marketplace. Next, she talks about her trip to the Soviet Union, showing some of the items she picked up on the trip. This is followed by a way to keep kids amused during cross country rides. Finally, she shows the jewelry collection that she amassed over the years.

Our Fran, WNEW 1969

00252 (Time: 41:00 (color))

Fran Lee appears in the first of a series of weekday programs on WNEW Channel Five in New York, offering advice and household tips for her viewers. In this very first episode, she gives tips on vacuuming and making chicken soup. This is followed by another episode in which she tours Irvington Thrift Shop. She interviews several of the women who work there. Then she appears in a or the Whistle dish washer. This show eventually evolved into the Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee, an afternoon movie with a ten-minute segment hosted by Fran Lee.

The New Yorkers Show 1967 to 1968-05

The New Yorker Show, WNEW 1967

00344 (Time: 7:50 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows host Sonny Fox how to make stockings and hats from old sweaters. She tries a hat on Sonny Fox, the same hat Ernie Kovacs, Johnny Carson, Steve Allen and Mike Douglas.

The New Yorker Show 09/08/1967

00353 (Time: 8:43 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears and demonstrates her flu remedies. Sonny Fox pretends to be ill with the flu; she puts him to bed and nurses him back to health.

The New Yorker Show WNEW 01/02/1968

00274 (Time: 14:45 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears on the New Yorker Show with Sonny Fox. She shows off her gown which she bought second hand. She once owned a second hand business called Rumbas Off.

The New Yorker Show 04/30/1968

00363 (Time: 10:20 (B&W))

Sonny Fox introduces Fran Lee who, with Linda Lavin, shows how to fix old lamp shades with old undergarments. Fran Lee seems to be competing with the band as she shows how to fix lamps. Critic Stuart Kline steps out towards the end to help her wrap the segment up.

The New Yorker Show, WNEW May 1968

00259 (Time: 8:45 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears on The New Yorker show with Joyce Susskind and Leon B. on WNEW Channel Five. At this point in her career, Fran Lee was modeling as a sick person for a series of ads for medical products. She shows how to care for furs and stoles.

Fran Lee appears, showing the audience how to take old furniture from the Salvation Army and remake it or turn it into something different. She shows a chest of drawers turned into a small closet for children, using the old drawers as end tables or as spice shelves as an example. Don Ameche then shows off his "fix-it", a wagon made from on of the drawers, trying to show up Fran Lee. She refers to him as "Mr. Fix-It".

Langford-Ameche Show 1949

Fran Lee shows how to make various items to decorate the Thanksgiving table and add a little spice to the holiday.

Langford-Ameche Show 1949

00346 (Time: 6:47 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows how one can fix up and make old lamps look like new.

Langford-Ameche Show 1949

00349 (Time: 6:56 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows how to care for a refrigerator. She also shows the types of foods to place in a refrigerator.

Langford-Ameche Show 1950

00356 (Time: 5:00 (B&W))

Fran Lee talks about to care for family members who come down with the flu. She puts Don Ameche to bed, and shows she would take care of him if he was ill.

"The Tidy Dee Lady" Mid-1950s to 1960s

The Tidy Dee Lady

00223 (Time: 2:25 (B&W))

Fran Lee is the "Tidy Dee Lady" in this segment for an unidentified program. She teaches children how to clean their refrigerator. Eyewitness Exclusive, WABC 07/14/1972

00319 (Time: 21:34 (B&W))

Gil Noble and Roger Grimsby host this program featuring Fran Lee talking about the dog feces problem in New York. The show usually ran Sunday mornings.

Girl Talk - Menopause 05/25/1965

00359 (Time: 6:48 (B&W))

Virginia Graham hosts this show for women. Fran Lee appears with Doctor Ruth Francois and Doctor Sophia Friedman. They discuss menopause and Fran Lee talks about the problems she had physically and mentally when she went through menopause. Fran Lee started a group for women called Menonomous.

Fran Lee Talks to John Pitman

00266 (Time: 4:24 (color))

Fran Lee talks about how she became interested in consumer reporting. John Pitman is a talk show host from England. She explains her interest in panty hose and how she came to attack the hose industry.

Mary Ritt 06/09/1960 00357 (Time: 6:38 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears with Mary Ritt and shows how to make bathing suits out of old sweaters.

Memory Lane 03/08/1962

00264 (Time: 16:00 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears on Memory Lane with Joe Franklin on ABC. They talk about her early television appearances in the 1940s. This was apparently Fran Lee's comeback to television, dated 3/8/62. She attacks Madison Avenue for the decreasing number of innovative women on television. She then shows how to make hats out of old sweaters. Memory Lane was a morning show on ABC that featured people who were famous at one time or another. Joe Franklin.

Mike Douglas, Children Before Dogs

00323 (Time: 14:20 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows host Steve Allen how to make hats and bikinis out of sweaters.

That Show starring Joan Rivers 12/31/1968

00321 (Time: 19:42 (B&W))

Fran Lee shows host Joan Rivers and guest Soupy Sales how she came to be known as Mrs. Fix-It. She shows off her hats and bikinis made of old sweaters.

00204 (Time: 5:33 (B&W))

Fran Lee appears on NBC's Today Show and demonstrates how to make a hat from the remains of an old fur coat. She is interviewed by a woman identified as Joan. She also shows how to make a stylish pocket book out of old furs. She shows her hats made from sweaters and home-made jewelry.

The Tonight Show starring Johnny Carson March 18, 1963

Who Do You Trust? (Johnny Carson) 1962

Fran Lee's appearance on the game show Who Do You Trust? featuring Johnny Carson and Ed McMahon. She explains how she came to be known as Mrs. Fix-it. Fran Lee taped this commercial for Plunge drain cleaner at the then WNEW (later WNYW) studios in New York. The commercial ran during the Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee.

Fran Lee is the doubting Thomas in these series of commercials, first with Tide detergent, where she doubts that children's muddiest clothes can be cleaned with Tide. Next she doubts very muddy slacks by Verilan can be cleaned properly. Finally, she doubts that Vicks cold tablets can relieve her cold.

Whistle Pump 1969

00083 (Time: 1:00 (color))

Fran Lee presents Whistle dish washing liquid in this commercial spot on WNEW (later WNYW) Channel 5 New York. These spots usually ran during the Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee

Whistle Commercial 1969

This commercial, taped at the WNEW (later WNYW) Channel Five studios in New York is for Whistle dish washing liquid. Fran Lee introduces the large economy size and the regular pump. The commercial ran during the Ladies Day Movie with Fran Lee.

Fran Lee tells the viewers about a Whirlpool exhibition to be held at the Felt Forum. This brief spot ran on WNEW Channel Five in New York.

Fran Lee is featured in this 10-second spot for Wollf's Kasha, spoon feeding it to a man playing her husband.
