Abstract: Letters, 1858-1862, by and relating to William Strückman (also spelled Strickman and Stickman) of New York City, a bugler with the U.S. Cavalry, 3rd Regiment Mounted Rifles, stationed at the School of Cavalry Practice at Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and at Fort Stanton, New Mexico. Letters discuss military life, hardship of travel, and injuries received. Letters state that Strückman drowned while crossing the Rio Grande in May, 1862. Three letters are in Dutch
