545	James Schoolcraft Sherman (1855-1912), vice president of the United States is the son of Richard Updike Sherman and Mary Frances Sherman. #b He was raised in the New Hartford township outside Utica. Sherman was educated in local schools, Whitestown Seminary and Hamilton College. He received an A.B. in 1878 and an L.L.B. in 1879. Sherman practiced law before decid**ing to enter politics as a Republican against his father's wishes who was a Democrate Sherman political career includes being elected mayor of Utica (1884); member of the House of Representtatives (1887-91; 1893-1903); chairman of the congressional campaign committees and vice president under Taft (1908-1912). Renominated in 1912, Sherman died before the close of the campaign. Sherman married Carrie Babcock, with whom he had three sons.

- Subjects covered are the campaign election for vice-presidency, Sherman's candidacy for Speaker of the House of Representatives (1899), his control of patronage and party machinery, his defeat by Roosevelt for chairmanship of the New York Republican Convention in 1910, the Progressive Party, legislation enacted during the Roosevelt and Taft administration, especially the Payne-Aldrich Tariff of 1909, the Republican Party, reports of the Utica Trust and Depository Company of which he was President, veteran claims, request for support to pass or defeat bills and endorsements for appointments.
- Correspondents are members of Congress, Department heads in Washington, members of the Roosevelt and Taft cabinent, constitutes, business and personal correspondents. Correspondents noted are Elishu Root, John Sharp Williams, P.C. Knox, Theodore Roosevelt and Williah H. Taft. Copies of Sherman's replies are scattered throughout series one.
- Series two, financial documents are personal accounts, 1896-1912 of Sherman. Series three, papers regarding contested elections, 1896, concerns Sherman. It contains letters, petitions and legal documents. Series four, writings are Sherman's speeches. Series five, scrapbooks focuses on Sherman political career and politics (9 vols). The remaining material is graphics, photographs, artifacts and printed material.
