Description John Appleton Stewart (1865-1928), a manufacturer and promoter, was born in Morrisville, New York to James Stephen and Emeline Plizabeth (Tucker) Stewart. He was educated at Cazenovia (New York) Seminary and at Fort Edward Collegiate Institute. As a manufacturer he held at various times such positions as director of the Electric Purifying Company, director of the Reynolds Ice Machine Company, president of the Carbonating Company of America and director of the American Ammone Company. Stewart was well-known in the northeast and Washington, D.C. for his promotion of patriotic causes and his interest over the years in "good will between the United States and England." He foundedwith Joseph Butler of Ohio the Sulgrave Institution that had as its primary purpose friendship between the American and English people and as its secondary purpose preservation of Sulgrave Manor, George Warhington's ancestral home in England. Stewart was best remembered as the president of the New York State League of Republican Clubs for twenty-six (26) years, but his political and patriotic activities extended beyond labors with the Republican Clubs and Sulgrave Institution. Most notably, he spearheaded movements for celebrations of the 100th anniversary of peace among English-speaking peoples (1814-1914/15) and the bi-centennial commemoration of George Washington's birthday (1732-1932). Stewart was a member or officer of civic and political organitations for three decades. He was the vice-president of the American Patriots, executive chârman of the American Society (an organization devoted to national unity) and chairman of the Hoover-for-President Association. His first wife, Alice Collins, died in 1900. Stewart and Ida Fassoli Stewart, his widow, had no children and resided in Brooklyn at the time of his death in November of 1928.

Frincipal correspondents include heodore E. Burton (banker & congressman), Michael Penry Butler (educator), Joseph Choste (diplomat), George B. Cortelyou (secretary of commerce & labor and secretary of the treasury), James G. Davis (secretary of labor), Simeon Fess (U.S. senator), John G. Foster (diplomat), John Hays Hammond (mining engineer), William McAdoo (secretary of the treasury), Charles Nagel (secretary of commerce & labor), T.

Platt (U.S. senator), Daniel A. Roed (congressman), Elihu Root (secretary of war and secretary of state), Jacob Schiff (philanthropist eri broker), James Wilson (secretary of agriculture), and Leonard Wood (army general).
