Sayre (1932-2001), author, critic and cultural historian, including correspondence, research notes, audiotapes (and transcripts) of her interviews, typescripts of her writings including books, articles, essays, reviews, lectures and speeches; papers relating to her teaching of creative nonfiction; diary notes; personal miscellaneous papers including college notes and compositions; and photographs.

Biographical note

Nora Sayre (1932-2001), journalist, author and film critic, was born in Hamilton, Bermuda, on September 20, 1932. Her father, Joel G. Sayre (1900-1979), was a reporter, Hollywood screenwriter, and author. During World War II he was foreign correspondent for *The New Yorker* attached to the Persian Gulf Command. Her mother, Gertrude Lynahan Sayre, was an editor and reporter.

Born into a literary family, Nora became acquainted during her youth with many literary figures who were friends or associates of her parents, including John O'Hara, James Thurber, Edmund Wilson, and the photographer, Walker Evans. After graduating from Radcliffe, she went to Europe hoping to find work as writer or journalist. Unable to find work in Paris, she settled in London, where she became a writer on the staff of the *New Statesman* reviewing French and American books. During her London years she also contributed short pieces to the *Manchester Guardian* and the *Twentieth Century* (a London magazine). Through Edmund Wilson she had been introduced to Arthur Koestler, who helped her to get settled; and through Koestler and his wife, the novelist Elizabeth Jane Howard, she was introduced to the social life of the London literati.

Upon her return to New York she continued to write for the *New Statesman* as its first American correspondent (1964-1970) covering various social and political issues including mayoral politics, the antiwar movement, and the New York theatre. She also contributed numerous articles to the *New York Times Book Review*, the *Nation*, *Esquire* and other magazines. From 1973 to 1975 she was film critic for the *New York Times*. She published three books of social and cultural criticism of America during the post W.W. II. period: *Sixties Going on Seventies* (1973); *Running Time: Films of the Cold War* (1982); and *Previous Convictions: A Journey through the 1950s* (1995). Her last book, *On the Wing: A Young American Abroad* (2001) contained her reminiscences of her childhood and youth and her life in London during the 1950s.

In addition to her literary work, Ms Sayre taught courses on nonfiction writing and journalism in the Writing Program at Columbia University. She also lectured widely and gave workshops at various colleges and universities. At the time of her death she was planning a book on "American obsessions" based upon her observations of American political conventions. Her marriage in 1957 to a British diplomat, Robert R. Neild, ended in divorce. She died in New York on August 8, 2001.

Scope and content note

The papers include correspondence from Ms Sayre's English and American friends including authors, editors, writers and journalists; original handwritten letters to her lover while she was living abroad in Paris and London which describe her social and literary life including anecdotal accounts of encounters with notable literary figures; a large file of research notes and papers for her writings on American culture, politics and society; audiocassettes, notes and transcripts of her interviews with actors, authors, Hollywood screenwriters, playwrights, lawyers and others relating to blacklisting in the motion picture industry, loyalty oaths, racial desegregation, and congressional investigations into communism and subversive activities; typescripts of her published books and of her speeches, lectures, articles, essays, book reviews, film reviews, and fictional writings; papers relating to her teaching of creative nonfiction writing; and diary notes and notebooks recording her travels abroad, her social life and activities, her intimate thoughts and introspections, and extensive notes in the form of reminiscences of her parents, especially her father, Joel G. Sayre, the breakup of her marriage, and her loneliness and frustration at her failure to find an enduring love relationship. Included also are college notes and compositions kept while a student at Radcliffe College; pocket calendars and address books: photographic portraits and snapshots of Ms. Savre and members of the Savre and Lynahan families; posters; and other personal miscellany.

Series I. Correspondence, 1948-2001

The correspondence is arranged into three subseries: A. Chronological; B. Alphabetical; and C. Family.

A. Chronological

The correspondence, which is arranged chronologically in the period 1948-2001, is from Sayre's English and American friends, acquaintances, editors, journalists, literary agents, publishers, and readers of her books and articles. There are occasional drafts of outgoing correspondence from Sayre. The bulk of the correspondence is of a miscellaneous nature there being only a few letters to Sayre from a given correspondent scattered throughout the chronological series. The correspondence reflects mainly Sayre's literary life and social activities.

B. Alphabetical, 1950-1996

The alphabetically arranged correspondence consists of correspondence from Sayre's English and American friends, including authors, editors, writers, and journalists, and with her publishers. The correspondence is incoming, excepting for the correspondence with James Stern and with Peter H. Judd.

Included in the Peter H. Judd file are some 165 lengthy handwritten letters (1950-1965) from Nora to Peter, her Harvard friend and lover, while he was on active duty at Fort Dix, New Jersey and while he was studying at Oxford University in England. The bulk of the letters by Nora were written from Paris and London. They offer an unusually rich and colorful documentation of her social and literary life there, her daily routines, her searches for lodging and employment, her literary work in progress, her struggles to establish herself as a writer, and her relationship with Judd. Included are numerous anecdotal accounts of encounters with notable literary figures and others including Albert Camus, Charlie Chaplin, John Davenport, Walker Evans, Graham Greene, David Hughes, Arthur Koestler,. A. J. Liebling, Tyrone Power, Ben Shahn, Stephen Spender, Alice Toklas, Elizabeth Jane Howard, and Mai Zetterling.

The James Stern file includes a file of photocopies of mainly typewritten correspondence (1966-1993) from Nora Sayre addressed to her English friend, the author James Stern, and his wife, Tania; and an extensive file of photocopies (1970-1992) of Stern's letters to her. The correspondence concerns mainly literary matters, literary gossip and anecdotes, and social life and activities. Included are a few original letters from James Stern, and a few photographs and memorabilia of the Sterns.

The correspondence from the author, Gwendolyn Reed, includes lengthy letters describing her travels in Bali, Indonesia, Bihan, India, Penang, Malaysia, Katmandu, Nepal, and in Queensland, Australia.

There are one or more letters from Eric Bentley, James M. Cain, Malcolm Cowley, Walker Evans, James T. Farrell, Alger Hiss, Elizabeth Jane Howard, Elia Kazin, Robert Kee, John Leonard, Arthur Miller, Sean O'Casey, Tyrone Power, Ned Rorem, Budd Schulberg, William Shawn, James Thurber, and Alice B. Series II. Research Files

The Research Files, which comprise almost one-half of the collection, are arranged into two files: A. Name/Subject file; and B. Films.

A. Name/Subject File

The Name/Subject file contains Ms Sayre's research materials for her books, articles, and essays on American culture, politics and society during the decades of the 1950s-1970s, especially her books *Previous Convictions: A Journey Through the 1950s; Running Time: Films of the Cold War*, and *Sixties Going on Seventies*. The bulk of the papers consist of handwritten notes made on spiral notepads (disbanded); typescript drafts and/or printed copies of published articles; and printed ephemera. Some files contain miscellaneous correspondence of Ms Sayre with friends, scholars and others relating to her research. Included are extensive notes kept by Ms Sayre during her attendance at political conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties; notes made for her interviews with participants in the political and social events covered by her writings; and typed transcripts of her interviews. The file titles are Ms Sayre's.

Series III. Interview Notes and Transcripts

The interviews were conducted by Ms Sayre during the 1970s in preparation of her historical writings on American society, culture and politics. *Audiotaped interviews are listed in Series. XII Sound Recordings*.

The notes and transcripts are arranged alphabetically by name of interviewee. They consist of Ms Sayre's handwritten notes hurriedly scrawled in spiral notebooks (now disbanded) made during the interview; and typed transcripts of interviews made from her notes or from audiotapes. Parts of some transcripts bear the notation "not on tape". A transcript of an interview conducted by Barbara Hogensen with Albert and Frances Hackett is filed at the end of the alphabetical series. Additional notes and transcripts of interviews are scattered in Series II. Research Papers as noted below.

The bulk of the interviews are with persons affected by Congressional and other official investigations into Communism, Communists, and subversive activities which occurred in America during the 1950s in the aftermath of World War II, largely under the influence of Senator Joseph McCarthy. The interviews were conducted by Ms Sayre with screenwriters, novelists, lawyers, theatre critics, playwrights, actors, and others including Leonard Boudin, Harold Clurman, Malcolm Cowley, James T. Farrell, Elia Kazan, Ring Lardner, Dwight Macdonald, Arthur Miller, and Victor Rabinowitz. A wide range of subject matters is covered including blacklisting in the motion picture industry, the House Un-American Activities Committee, the Eastland Committee, loyalty oaths, the F.B.I., the Cold War, the Korean War, the Socialist Party, the Communist Party, racial desegregation, and expatriate Americans. Many interviewees relate their personal experience during the 1920s-1930s. The interviews were made during the course of her research for her historical writings, especially her book *Previous Convictions: a Journey through the 1950s* (New Brunswick, N.J., Rutgers University Press c1995),

Series VIII. Diary Notes and Notebooks, ca. 1949-1994

This series consists of holograph notes kept by Ms Savre on loose sheets, spiral notepads (disbanded) and notebooks arranged chronologically in the period c1949-1994 and undated. The notes record her thoughts, introspections, social life and activities from her student days at The Putney School and Radcliffe College throughout much of her adult life. The notes in the earlier period (1950s to mid-1960s) describe her efforts to become established in Europe as a freelance writer. Included are shipboard notes made while crossing the Atlantic, lengthy notes of her travels in England, Wales, France and Ireland; her life in Paris where she studied French literature while searching for employment as a writer; and extensive notes relating to her settlement in London, the arrangement of her domestic affairs there, her meetings with the London literati including Arthur Koestler and the novelist, Elizabeth Jane Howard; and her brief marriage and divorce. During the later period there are notes relating to her sojourns at Yaddo in the summers of 1986 and 1989; her literary work, and extensive notes in the form of reminiscences of her parents, especially her father, the breakup of her marriage, her romantic life, and her loneliness and frustration at failing to find an enduring love relationship. Included is one folder of notes made by Ms Sayre taken from her letters to Peter Judd.
